TO LICENSE NEWSBOYS.

SYDNEY, Oct. 21—At the last meeting of the city council an ordinance dealing with the licensing of newsboys and imposing a penalty upon those selling without a license was considered. Action was deferred until next meeting. The ordinance is aimed chiefly at a New Brunswick paper called the Indicator, and does not apply to local papers. The by-law in effect states that no person shall sell or offer for sale on any street or public places in the city of Sydney, any newspaper, periodical, magazine, pamphlet, book or paper of any kind without first obtaining a license therefor which shall be signed by the mayor or deputy mayor, and must specify the name of the newspaper or magazine. A fee of not more than \$20 will be charged, and the license will be revocable at any time. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with the provisions of the ordinance shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars for each offence, and in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month and to cancellation of license.

—Acting under instructions from the Fishery Department Capt. John Ferguson, special fishery officer, has been engaged during the past few weeks in watching the oyster fishing industry in Richmond Bay, and Wednesday night last succeeded in catching James Mountain of Malpeque engaged in fishing oysters with the use of drags. Capt. Ferguson seized the boat with about six barrels of oysters on board and also went out to the bed where Mr. Mountain had been fishing and where he found two drags which had been buoyed there. These also were seized. On Saturday last Capt. Ferguson also seized the motor boat with some drags and other illegal fishing gear on board belonging to two young men named Simmons and Lecky of Lot 16. Capt. Ferguson has been watching this lot for several nights during the week and on Saturday last bore down on them, taking them by surprise and not giving them time to get rid of the illegal work of which he confiscated. Two other boats are also under suspicion and if the owners persist in this illegal work their boats and gear will meet the same fate as those already captured and work in the bay. Capt. Ferguson has also been keeping a watch on the fishermen and dealers for small oysters. One day last week he visited Captain Island where he overhauled about thirty barrels of oysters belonging to a number of men, which were returned to the beds. In an interview with Capt. Ferguson he informed The Guardian's representative that he had instructions from the department to put a stop to the illegal fishing by drags and also to the taking of under-size oysters, and he intended to see that this law was strictly enforced, and would advise all those engaged in this work to keep within the law in order to save themselves further trouble and expense. Pending instructions from the department the boats and gear seized will be held until the matter of the seizures are investigated.

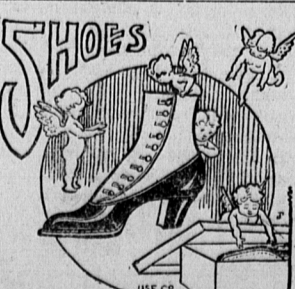

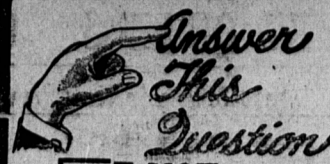

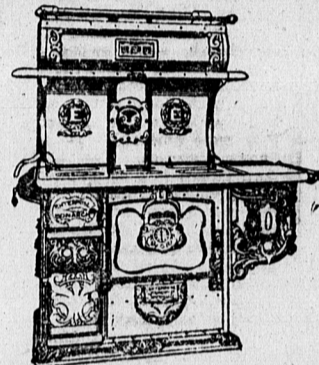
