Lloyd, the proprietors of the London Daily Chronicle and Lloyd's News, have purchased outright the property of the Sturgeon Falls, Ont., Paper Company and valuable concessions from the Ontario Government. The Lloyd are the largest paper makers in England, and the Sturgeon Falls property will now be the principal source of supply for pulp.
