minutes before you saw it in the Patriot?

Witness: No; I saw that in the Patriot for the first time.

Mr. McKinnon then examined the witness again in regard to the petition. He asked the following questions:

Q.—Is that intermination there in your hand-writing? The words "To your highest interest." Who changed that?

A.—Well, now, let me see that.

Q.—This is the petition: "We are confident that it will be of the highest interest to demand an investigation." What made that intermination? That writing is not the same as the rest: "We are confident it will be to your interest?"

A.—That is not mine at all. I used the words that are erased.

Q.—When you left it with Mr. Johnston were those words in there "to your highest interest"?

A.—Yes. I don't know who changed it.

Q.—The change was made since you left this document?

A.—Yes.

Q.—So that since the document was signed by you and those other people it was changed?

A.—Yes; it was changed Mr. McKinnon. I know my own writing. I never changed that. That has been changed since.

Q.—Did you deliver it to him personally?

A.—Yes.

Murphy was asked the question by Mr. McKinnon, whether he had not as a matter of fact caused a lot of disturbance himself. He gave the answer, "Well, I am a kind of an agitator."

At the conclusion of Murphy's evidence, Mr. Bonnell was recalled and examined as to his state of mind.
