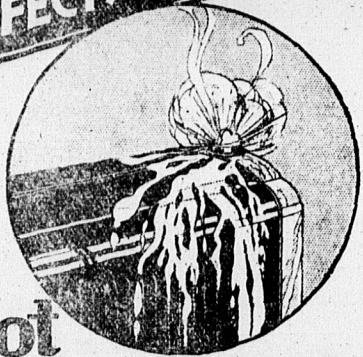

—MONCTON MINISTER IN SUMMERSIDE—The services in the Summerside Presbyterian Church were conducted by the Rev. S. J. MacArthur, B.D., of Moncton, on Sunday, November 23. Large congregations listened to eloquent discourses. Mr. MacArthur, who is one of the most prominent ministers in the Maritime Synod, began his ministry on the Island in the former Presbyterian Church of Bedeque. Many old friends took the opportunity of good roads and good weather and drove in to hear him. The Rev. C. J. St. C. Jeans, Minister of Summerside Presbyterian Church, conducted Anniversary Services in the First Presbyterian Church, Moncton, preaching to large audiences at both diets of worship. A most notable work is being done at Moncton by the Presbyterian congregation, under the leadership of Mr. MacArthur.

—SPEAKS HIGHLY OF RUSSIA—Although glad to be home again on Prince Edward Island, Mr. James H. Prichard, Jim, as he is affectionately called by his many friends, speaks very favorably of the treatment he received during his eleven months stay in the far eastern region of Siberia. His first day at home at Summerside, Mr. Prichard was kept busy answering the many questions put to him about his trip. Mr. Prichard left here shortly before Christmas, and had his Christmas dinner on board the boat that took him to Japan. He went to Siberia at the invitation of the Russian Government to instruct students in the mysteries of fox ranching, and after a long and tedious journey arrived at Sedanka, where the fox station was. This place is about twenty miles inland from Vladivostok, the chief port of Siberia and the port of call for boats going to Japan. Mr. Prichard had never less than twenty-four students under him during his stay. He sees a great future for the fox industry in that country as the climate is very bracing and cold, the air is clear and there is very little snow, making it an ideal climate for fur bearing animals. In the summer the heat is intense but the foxes do not seem to mind that very much. Food for the foxes is plentiful, especially fish, which can be obtained in large quantities from the rivers. There are about 2,000 silver foxes in captivity, besides blue and white foxes and some sable. It is the intention of the authorities to gradually start up ranches in the Northern Pacific, where fish and deer meat are obtainable in immense quantities for the catching. Salmon, cod and herring are very plentiful in eastern Siberia and are exported in large quantities. Salmon is very plentiful and is packed in tins and sent abroad. About 800,000 cases of salmon were shipped this season from Vladivostok, thus giving employment to a great number of people. Japan imports a considerable quantity of salmon from Siberia. Rice grown in the fields about twenty miles from where Mr. Prichard stayed was also shipped to Japan. It is sown by hand and the crops are large. Vladivostok has two up-to-date theatres and a population of some 150,000. Some of the best plays are to be seen there. Conditions in Russia are improving, said Mr. Prichard, their education system is good and far ahead of our own and everyone has an equal chance of education. Mr. Prichard declined to say very much about the system in Russia today, but he says they are making good. They are a kind and hospitable people and would share anything with you. Mr. Prichard brought back with him some Russian bread. It is very dark; also some elaborately carved vases and other little curios. What looked like a cake of chewing tobacco turned out to be a piece of Russian tea. Mr. Prichard said he did not know for certain whether he would return next year. He was twenty-five days coming home via Japan and Vancouver. He looked in at the Royal Winter Fair at Toronto on his way home and thought the exhibits were on the average better than last year.—S.

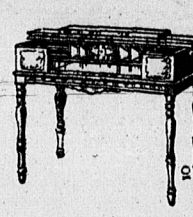

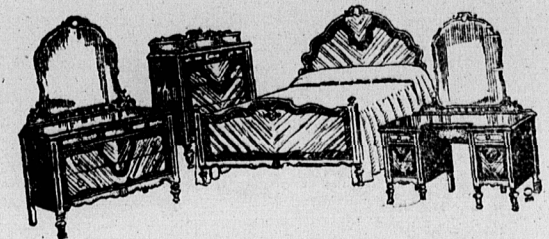

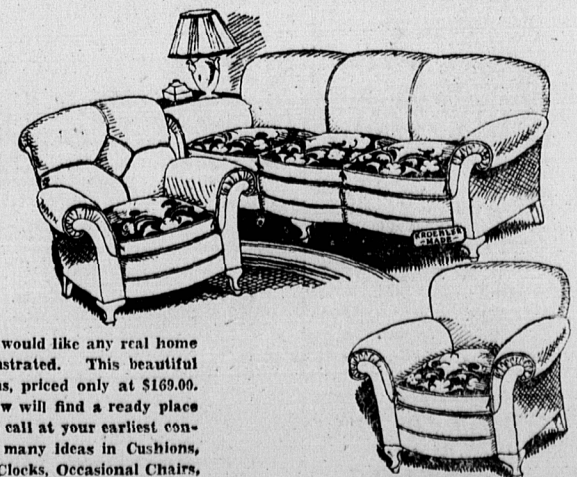
