Possibility Of Trouble For Nazis Seen

LONDON, July 10 —(OP)— R. A. Butler, Foreign Affairs Undersecretary, declared in a broadcast tonight that "complications in the European scene may develop which will draw the attention of our enemy away from us."

Aside from its difficulties in holding down the subject peoples, Germany will have to face the "old major rivalries" between powers, the Under-Secretary added.

"Italy and Russia will each have its view about the Balkans. Spain will have its own tradition of pride and independence. There will be varying views about the Dardanelles. There will be several voices in the Mediterranean. The loudest will be the bark of the big guns of our battle fleet."

"... There are complications enough for any power which seeks to dominate the continent, and then the world. We must hold on and let his cauldron simmer."

"No doubt the pot will soon be calling the kettle black." In order to succeed Hitler not only would have to take the United Kingdom but would have to storm the whole Empire. After saying it was right for the Mother Country to be the front line, Mr. Butler recalled that contingents from the Dominions were here to help.

As one lesson of the war, he continued, "we may well learn to link up our future even more with the world than we do now. We may with their (The Empire's) cooperation and encouragement learn to spread our sea and air bases, our industries more widely over the British Commonwealth and British colonial system."

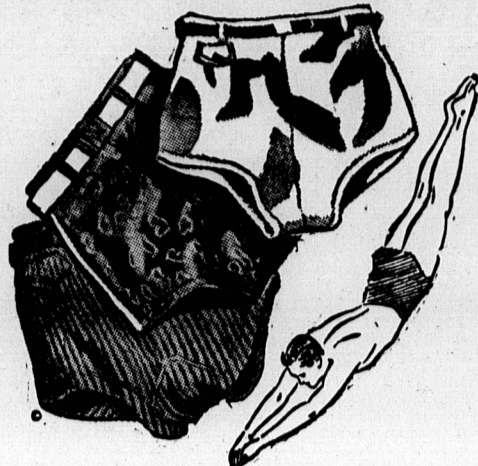
