(Continued from page 1) Mr. Burke emphasized the importance of using "masculine males" rather than their perhaps slicker but more effeminate brothers.

A discussion of cross foxes was a feature that had everyone interested. Mr. Mers pointed out that the dyers could now produce very good imitations of certain types of cross foxes and said: "If you intend to breed cross foxes concentrate on the silvery types with distinctive markings in neck and shoulders." Also in mating females to outcross foxes, such as breaks, etc., do not use poor females - use good ones, he stressed.

The visit of Mr. Mavers to Summerside and Charlottetown and his talk to fur ranchers at both centres is greatly appreciated. Everyone who has had the privilege of listening in or reading his remarks must have learned something of value to the industry.

Dr. C. K. Gunn of the Fox Experimental Station, Summerside, was present most of yesterday and talked informally to breeders and problems connected with line breeding in breeding, etc., using charts to illustrate his remarks.

It is unfortunate that weather and road conditions were so unfavorable, thus preventing a great many fox breeders from being in attendance at the demonstrations.

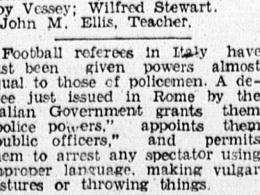
