Belgium and East Africa

(Special to The Guardian.) PARIS, May 9.—The Belgium delegation has issued a note relative to Great Britain being appointed mandatory for German East Africa, saying that it is unable to believe that this action has been taken by the Council of Four in view of Belgium's important operation in Africa, her sacrifices to insure the conquest of German East Africa, and the fact that her situation has given her rights on that continent. The note says Belgium is unable to admit that German East Africa could be disposed of by agreement in which she has not participated.

Austrian Delegates Have Differees

(Special to The Guardian.) PARIS, May 9.—The Austrian delegation numbering from 40 to 50 persons is expected to arrive at St. Germain on May 12. Information received from French sources is that the delegation has not as yet left Vienna owing to difficulties encountered in selecting its members because of differences of opinion regarding the proposed incorporation of German Austria in Germany.
