New Brunswick Potato Crop Shows Increase

GRAND FALLS, N.B., Oct. 18 - (CP) - Harvest by exceptionally favorable weather, the harvesting season in the province returned the largest crop in history and a per acre yield more than 40 per cent above last year's. One farmer obtained 1,932 barrels from 11 acres. The bumper crop caught many growers without sufficient storage space. As a result, surplus potatoes are being sold at a loss...
