THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THE CHINESE ARMY

The Troops Being Brought Up to a State of Efficiency Old Fashioned Methods Being Abolished—Modern Arms and Drill Introduced—Better Class of Officers.

LONDON, March 29.—Since the events of 1900 China has shown a desire to introduce long-needed reforms; in the case of the army this is seen very clearly, for China possesses now all the makings of a real national army, organized and drilled on the mode of the Japanese army, so that in fifteen years time it will have at least 150,000 soldiers on a peace footing. According to the recent law concerning the reorganization of the Chinese army, the thirty-six divisions, comprising the infantry, cavalry, artillery, engineers, and transport service are to be formed as they shall be required, and doubtless also with regard to the funds available therefore, from 1905 to 1922. In 1922 the active contingent capable of immediate mobilization will be 500,000 men, and the cost involved in maintaining the Imperial army will amount, according to the estimates, to fifty-four million taels, or £8,000,000 annually. For the present the provinces of Chihu, Honan, Chantung, and Shansi have been reorganized on new lines. They will comprise an active army, or chang pei-lun; a first line of reserve, supelkian; and a second reserve, khopeikian. The infantry, cavalry, and artillery are divided into regiments. The infantry, pootoo, is grouped either in brigades, six or in regiments, each of which is composed of three battalions. Finally, the base element is the young, of fourteen men, of whom two are non-commissioned officers.

officers, their drill, equipment, bearing, and, in fact, in every detail. This unification will be seen firstly in the suppression of the former method of calling the various armies after particular provinces, and then by disturbing the entire army among army corps which will be numbered. The arms are the same as those used in all modern armies in the five branches of arms. The old equipment of arms has been replaced already everywhere by modern material. The uniform of every branch of arms, and the badges denoting rank, have been duly fixed. The drilling of the troops throughout the Empire is exactly the same everywhere, and all the regulations concerning the command, rank, military honors, and the like are now uniform in the whole of China. It is quite possible that these utterances may be unduly optimistic, if not somewhat exaggerated. Still, if the countries of Europe ever see fit to return to Pekin with armed forces, they will have to send out thither something stronger than flying columns.—London "Globe."

PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE

Friday March 30th. The Bill incorporating St. Mary's Branch, No 254, C. M. B. A. was read a first time.

A Bill to further amend the city of Charlottetown Incorporation Act was introduced by Hon. Mr. Hughes. This bill is to grant power to issue debentures for permanent work. He also introduced a Bill to amend the Dental Act of Prince Edward Island, and a Bill to incorporate the Charlottetown Electric Transit and Power Co., Ltd. These bills were read a first time.

The Commissioner of Public Works, replying to Mr. Fraser, said that Webster's Mill Bridge has been used by the public, and that the Government had expended money upon it.

Hon. Mr. Hassard moved a resolution authorizing the Government to make arrangements with the Telephone Company of Prince Edward Island for the further extension of the system of telephones to various sections of this island hitherto not reached thereby, and also to authorize the Government to make arrangements for the granting of the subsidies and exemptions to said Company.

The resolution passed. Mr. Peters presented a bill the object of which is to enable the government to obtain a right of way from Hillsborough Bridge to the city.

Mr. Mathieson asked for a return to be tabled showing the total amount of all payments made on account of the public service from 31st December 1905 to 1st March 1906, for services rendered during the year 1906.

Hon. Mr. Peters promises to furnish the information.

The act respecting the registration of births, deaths, and marriages, in an amended form was re-introduced by Hon. Mr. Reid, and the House was discussing same when adjournment was made at 1 p. m. House will meet again at 3 p. m. on Monday.
