A meeting of the Seed Fair Committee was held in Summerside yesterday afternoon. At this meeting accounts were gone into, and a detailed statement made up for presentation to the meeting of the contributors to the Seed Fair to be held in the evening. Several recommendations were made, among them that the Fair next year be held three days instead of two and that the people of Summerside appoint two members on the Board of management.

A representative and fairly well attended meeting was held in the Y. M. C. A. last night on invitation of the Seed Fair Committee, James Carruthers in the chair. Sec'y Fowler presented the financial statement and also his comparative statement showing the growth of the Seed Fair. The total receipts amounted to \$317 and the expenditure \$307.27 leaving a balance of \$9.73. The number of exhibits was 656, as compared with 209 of last year. Excellent and practical addresses were delivered by the Mayor, several of the Councillors and other citizens all speaking of the future of the Seed Fair movement. A vote of thanks was tendered to the President and Secretary for their reports and to the Committee of management for the attention they have given the Fair. At the suggestion of the meeting appointed as Town members on the committee of management, George Godkin and Mayor Compton.

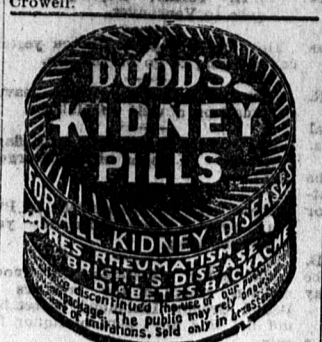
