The funeral of the late Daniel Coles took place from the residence of his father, Frederick Coles, Milton, on Monday, the 5th inst. The funeral procession was one of the largest seen in this place for a long time, there being about one hundred and twenty carriages; thus showing the respect of the entire community for the deceased and their sympathy with the bereaved family. Dan. was a favorite with old and young. Only last spring he left his native Isle to seek his fortune in the far West. About two weeks before his death he had contracted fever. He was placed in a hospital at Winnipeg but all efforts to prolong his days were unavailing and at the early age of twenty-three years his life's work was at an end. The funeral services were conducted by the Rev. Daniel McLean and the pall-bearers were Charles MacDuff, Wm. Bell, Nelson Bell, John Spence, Arthur Oxenham and Isaac Oxenham, who accompanied the remains from Winnipeg. Interment took place at Highfield Cemetery. Mr. and Mrs. Coles desire to express their gratitude to the friends and neighbors who have shown such sympathy in their time of sorrow.—Com.
