She succeeded in removing his hand and then told him that if he would spare her life she would give him money. He said he did not want money, but when she asked him what he did want, he did not reply.

Finally he let her go and started to go away with the remark: "I am crazy, I'm from Boston."

In the scuffle the old lady had a finger broken and was also scratched on the cheek. Mathers is a man between 30 and 40 years of age. E. M. Bill, of Shelbourne, is defending. It is expected he will elect to be tried under the speedy trials act.
