—The prohibition case against William McNeill, Summerside, heard before Stipendiary Wright, yesterday, was dismissed because important witnesses were not forthcoming.

—A meeting of the Dunk River Farmers' Institute will be held on Feb. 14th at 7 p.m. in the Wilnot Valley Hall. The subject of how to improve the Dairying Industry will be discussed. J. R. Edwards of North Wilshire will address the meeting.

—The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held Monday evening the mayor and all the councillors being present. In addition to the regular monthly bills, the smallpox bills were also passed. The bills in connection with the smallpox amounted to \$725.13 which were cut down to \$500 and accepted in full payment. The retiring councillors are Messrs Reid, Muttart and Cox says the Patriot.

—A meeting of the Summerside Driving Park and Exhibition Association was held on Friday last. James A. McNeill was appointed president and G. M. Reid, secretary. The directors decided to make extensive preparations for the way of buildings says the Patriot. An additional hundred feet will be added to the present exhibition building and additional stable accommodation as well as more space for cattle and poultry. He was a leader among men, and none the less so in the affairs of the Baptist Church, of which he was a worthy member and honoured deacon. The hospitality, kindness, and patience of his home life were much above ordinary. Those who know him best testify to this. His son, Archie, and daughter, Emma,—the former a student at McGill, and the latter, wife of Rev. J. B. Champion, are among the eight children who with the deeply sorrowing widow now mourn their loss.—Com.

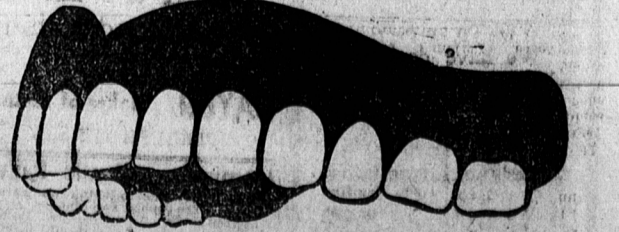
