SPLENDID RANCH.—Work has been begun on the ranch of the Canada-Atlantic Fox and Fur Company, Ltd., on their 165-acre farm, Union Road. Lumber and other necessary material are being got up, and the first of next week will see a start in the building of the pens. Forty pens will be erected, and the ranch will be the most modern in structure, along the lines suggested by Dr. Higgins, Dominion Pathologist, who recently visited the province. There will be a five-foot deadline between the pens. The pens will be constructed in four rows, ten pens in each row, and in the center of each row there will be an avenue 15 feet wide. At the end of each avenue there will be an observation house. Around each pen will be cleared a space of five feet from the door. The doors of the pens will have shoots through which food may be thrown to the foxes. It will be possible, by the construction of the ranch, for the keeper to take up his position at the windows of the observation house and see all the foxes feeding. No expense will be spared to make the ranch one of the best appointed and most complete.
