The Markets At A Glance

WINNIPEG, Feb. 6 (CP)—
Sharp price declines at Chicago
and fairly liberal selling here for
American accounts depressed the
future values in the final hour
today on the Winnipeg Grain Ex-
change.

CHICAGO, Feb. 6 (AP)—
The price of May rye nose-dived
sharply today amid talk of a gov-
ernmental request that commo-
dity markets aid in controlling
speculation in grain and cotton.
May rye closed at 44.07 a bushel,
off the full five cents for the sec-
ond consecutive day.

MONTREAL, Feb. 6 (CP)—
Duties and goods made some pro-
gress toward higher ground in trad-
ing today on the Stock Exchange
and Curb Market and both groups
were marked up in the indices.
Futures, industrials and banks un-
der pressure from some profit-tak-
ing slipped in the averages. Pivotal
metals were a strong spot among
the sub-divisions of shares
boarded.

NEW YORK, Feb. 6 (AP)—
Losses of fractions to around 1
point and more predominated in
today's Stock Market although a
fair-sized number of assorted in-
dustrials resisted the trend.

The Associated Press 60-stock
composite fell 3/4 of a point to 76.1.
The Dow Jones Industrial Average
closed at 111.34, down 1/4 point.
Selected issues in the gold group
advanced strongly under a heavy
demand today on the Toronto Ex-
change and the group netted an
index gain of 7/8, going to new
high for recent years. Base Metals
were carried down by the break in
Silver. The market was softened
by the buying rush in Czecho that
carried the price up to close at 2-
32 for a net gain of 62 cents. Sev-
eral golds including Auncer, Camp-
bell, Lake Luz, Lamaque and
Wright-Hargraves, firmed 15 to 35
cents.

Soil Survey Work Is Being Extended

Soil survey work presents an in-
teresting example of Experiment-
al Farm co-operation with Pro-
vincial agencies in which the meth-
od of operation has been evolved
to suit peculiar administrative
Under existing arrangements, the
Provincial Governments and the
Experimental Farms Service
each employ trained soil sci-
entists for survey work in all the
provinces. In certain provinces,
these men work under the tech-
nical supervision is exercised by
the Dominion soil survey staff.
In nearly all provinces, Personnel
form single operating units. The
soil survey staff of the Central
Farm at Ottawa correlates the
work between the provinces, and
surveys in Canada. Of this total,
54,038,000 acres were surveyed by
the provinces acting alone, while
38,138,000 acres covered before
Dominion-Provincial co-operation
went into effect.

which they are resident.
- Property or rental qualifications sufficient in time but having
removed from one Ward to another within 3 months next
preceding date of Election, entitles vote in former Ward
only.
