REOPENING OF THE GEDDIE MEMORIAL

Church at French River—Large Congregations and Impressive Addresses Delivered by Clergymen.

The Geddie Memorial Church at French River was reopened on Sabbath 9th of August. A very large congregation assembled filling the church to its utmost capacity. Rev. R. G. Strathie of Summerside preached a very eloquent and powerful sermon from the text: "Take heed to feed the church of the Lord, which he purchased with His own blood" indicating the great value of the church and the individual's relation to it.

In the evening a still larger congregation assembled so that a large number of people were unable to gain entrance. Rev. A. D. Stirling, the pastor of the church spoke of many who were interested in this old church because it was there, their ancestors loved to worship but a far greater number were desirous that it should be preserved in good repair and beautified because it is the church where Dr. John Geddie, the pioneer missionary of the Presbyterian church of Canada ministered and from this congregation he went out to Annetym. He then read Dr. Geddie's reply to the farewell address presented to him by his congregation when separating from his beloved people. It is copied from the original manuscript in Dr. Geddie's own handwriting. It had become so time worn as to be scarcely legible. It is dated Nov. 1846. The congregation then listened to the excellent addresses.

Rev. Mr. Nichols spoke on "Ye are living Epistles." Rev. Mr. Murray spoke on "Geddie, His courage, His heroism, the difficulties apparently unsurmountable and faced and overcome by him, and the great work he did for our church as well as for the heathen. We are beginning to see that he was one of the greatest if not the greatest man our church ever produced. He spoke also of the honour of having in our midst the only church now standing in which the great missionary ministered. The last address was by the Rev. Mr. Melvor of Alleghany, Pennsylvania who was on his way home to Cape Breton for a rest. He spoke a word of warning from Rev. 24. "Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee because thou hast lost thy first love." His address was excellent, and all regretted that a man of so much ability should not exercise it in his native country that is in such a great need of good men.

The choir had taken pains to provide suitable music and was assisted in the evening by Miss Murray who sang an appropriate solo. Although the meeting lasted over two hours and the evening was warm yet the interest was sustained throughout. The offering amounted to \$50.00.

The following is the address of Dr. Geddie. My Dear Brethren and Friends: I accepted with pleasure your testimonial of respect and esteem now that I am about to be separated from you through our connection as pastor and people has been comparatively of short duration. It affords me no small degree of comfort to reflect it has been distinguished by harmony peace and love. The eight years that I spent among you I cannot but regard as the happiest and I trust the most useful of my life. The measure of success which has attended my exertions for your spiritual good, eternity alone can reveal. Nevertheless I have the consolation to believe that my labor has not been altogether in vain or that I have spent my strength for naught. In seasons of greatest discouragement I have been encouraged by the hope that I have been honored to do something for Christ among you. Indeed without this consolation I should have paused before entering into an arduous and more arduous sphere of exertion, and whatever good has been the result of my brief sojourn among you, I ask you to give all the praise to Him who alone can give efficacy to the word of His grace. And as for myself I feel deeply humbled that the God of heaven should have condescended to work by such mean instrumentality. I trust that the cause of missions will not abate but rather increase by my removal from

you. Next to your own salvation it is your duty to interest yourselves in the spiritual welfare of your fellow men. It is awful criminality to remain unconcerned while myriads of our fellow creatures are going down to perdition. I rejoice that as a congregation you have been aroused to a sense of your duty on this subject; and as evidence of your sincerity have given the first contribution for the support of the mission in connection with our own church, and parted with the first labourer for a foreign field. Endeavour to become more and more a blessing to others and thus you may be blessed yourselves. I leave you not because my attachment to you has become in any way abated nor because I suspect that you are unwilling to retain me. Had not the stern call of duty directed my attention to another, a more arduous and less alluring field of labour, I could have ended my ministry among you. It was a painful struggle. Indeed, I could not reconcile my mind to the thought of leaving a part of the church around which my best affections have been entwined. Mrs. Geddie joins in gratefully acknowledging your kind wishes in our behalf and that of our little family and your commending us to the guardianship of him who holds the reins of the universe and in whose hands we shall be saved. He that is for us is greater than those that be against us. May the great head of the church speedily send a pastor for you, "who will be instant in season and out of season, who will reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long suffering and doctrine", and whose example may be a pattern to the flock. Finally, brethren farewell, perfect be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace and the God of love and peace shall be with you. Dated November, 1846.
