Ban On Chartered Buses To Have Varied Effect On Travelling Ball Teams

NEW YORK, May 22 (AP)—Baseball had its crystal ball working in the matter of transportation last night. It was that the last few months, so the minor leagues for the most part were ready for the latest ban on chartered bus travel.

An Associated Press survey came up with that general feeling today, in spite of pessimism in some quarters, the darkest of which was the statement by business manager Crowder Boyd of Jacksonville's Sally League club that the ban "would wreck minor leagues" as "90 percent of them use buses and would be unable to meet schedules by train."

Giants Throttle Dodgers 5-1

NEW YORK, May 22 (AP)—New York Giants throttled Brooklyn Dodgers 5-1 today with an early scoring rush that routed the previously unbeaten Ed Heaf after four innings.

The rookie right hander, who had won five straight games to lead all National League pitchers, was stalled with a two-run homer by Manager Mel Ott in the first inning and another circuit clot by Hank Leiber in the fourth as well as being tapped for two unearned runs in the third.

The fast getaway enabled lefty Cliff Melton to triumph easily even though a succession of three Brooklyn relief pitchers held the Giants to one hit and no runs in the last four innings and altogether the Dodgers out-hit New York 10-6.

Ban On Chartered Buses To Have Varied Effect On Travelling Ball Teams
