THE HOLSTEIN FRIESIAN BREED OF DAIRY CATTLE

digested and assimilated, over-doing her would sicken the animal at once and cows that make large yearly records cannot be "forced" in any particular. Just how much is safe to feed and keep the animal's digestion in the best possible condition is "artistic" work, and can only be learned by long experience. However, much is to be learned by all owners of dairy cows from these great cows and their work.

And the greatest economy in the production of milk and butter consists in keeping a dairy cow up to the limit of her production. That is, ascertain amount of feed is required to sustain the animal and the more she will consume and assimilate above this the greater will be our profit. And if we keep a cow one hundred days consuming what she could use in seventy-five days we certainly have to feed her enough to sustain life twenty-five days for nothing. And instead of this full feeding being detrimental to the cow it is just what nature has intended. And while its dangerous to feed other animals (having one stomach) to their full capacity with the dairy cow its entirely different providing always that the ration contains a proper amount of roughage as by the action of fibrous fodder pressing on the lining of the pouch or first stomach digestive juices are more liberally secreted hence the contented happy expression of a well filled cow chewing the cud or rather "eating" her food. And its evident we as dairy farmers have been keeping entirely too many cows for our available feed, and a great many who would be little loss to their owners if dead. The foundation of all successful dairying must be the right sort of cows, and while farmers will endeavor to breed an animal to use for the dairy that will also make good beef they are trying to run in two different directions at once and make a success of neither. We have one of the best countries on the face of the globe to operate dairy farming and have many advantages over our competitors in the world's markets such as cheap land and cheap labour, which makes it possible to raise cheap feed but the other essential is an economical machine to manufacture this feed into a high priced finished product else we are labouring in vain. We hear much of the fancy price Danish butter brings in the British market, and the objection is often made. That while our land is much cheaper feed worth less money etc. we cannot compete with the Danes because they receive a greater price for this product, this may be true if we exported butter to England but at present our butter production in the Maritime Provinces is not equal to home consumption and we have for several years back received a higher yearly average for best creamery butter in the Maritime markets than the Danes have in Britain, and if this little kingdom Denmark with an area less than New Brunswick can sell \$98,000,000

worth dairy and hog product in a year, why should not we do equally as well in proportion to our area. The secret of their success is this they made a specialty of the best paying lines of live stock farming, and cheapened the cost of production by a complete system of co-operation. Their farms are steadily increasing in production and they buy largely of mill feeds from other countries feeding them at a profit and still further enriching their land each farm, being a little manufacturing plant in this particular.

Our Federal Government is spending millions yearly to cheapen transportation from the west and immense tracts of fertile land will soon be under grain and our Island farmers will have strong competitors in the Maritime markets. Why attempt to compete in this soil impoverishing line of farming, with a great fertile plain where grain can be grown so much more cheaply. When we could use cheap grain as the Danes do and instead of decreasing the earning power our soil increase it many times. We as a province can only hope to grow and develop as we increase the productiveness of our land. We can't make the Island any larger but we could make it many times more productive supposing every acre could be made to earn double the value that it is today. It would mean at once double the business of every kind in operation double the population but not double the expense of operating all our public works. Population is what we desire but can only be retained as the land is made more productive. We have the example of how other countries who were of farming have prospered and if forced to take up this profitable line we as a province are ever to amount to anything it must be through co-operative dairying.

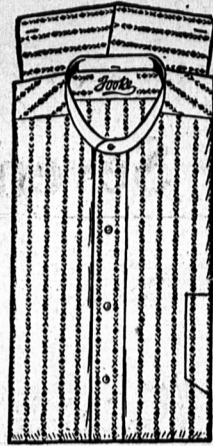

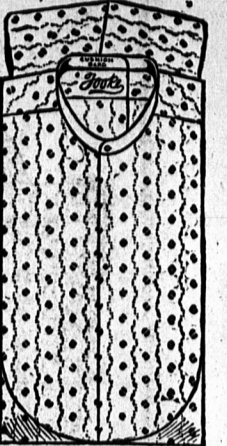
