## MORNING STOCK LETTER

(Received over Pittfield and Co's Private Wire)

**NEW YORK, June 28**—Gold in London this morning is 149s 1d compared with 149s 7 1/2d on Saturday. The London market opened firmer and gold stocks were again. The firmness in the London market is interesting in view of the rather aggressive speech Hitler made in Germany yesterday regarding Germany's position with relation to Spain. During the course of the speech he said that Germany wanted the world to know that Germany was not returning to work at Youngstown and to a lesser degree at Johnstown but the labor situation is still far from satisfactory. Dividend meetings scheduled for tomorrow are: Allied Chemical, American Can, Atchafalaya and United Gas Improvement. The rails on Saturday acted badly and made a new low for the year and in view of the absence of favorable news we would look on this morning to see how well additional selling is taken.

**JOHNSTOWN, Pa., June 28**—Bethlehem Steel mill is operating on a larger scale than Saturday notwithstanding that the picket lines are heavier this morning. Union claims that the strike is still on but was denied by Mayor Daniel J. Shields and Police Chief Harry L. Klunk. "This strike is now

over" said Shields. "The men are going back to the mill despite union efforts to deprive them of their fundamental rights to earn a living. John L. Lewis and his crowd will have to admit now that their strike has failed in Johnstown." Klunk said that the strike is definitely broken.

**NEW YORK, June 28**—Simon said in the House today that the British gold position is much better than formerly and that it is not likely that any sudden sustained loss of gold which could occur now could seriously embarrass Britain. The Chancellor said that henceforth gold and other assets held by the equalization account would be given every six months.

**TORONTO, June 28**—Hutchinson Lake—On 250 foot level 200 feet westerly from the shaft the face of the drift is reported to be in considerable free gold. The vein looks about 3 feet wide and is believed similar to the high grade surface find. Due to the erratic position of the ore further work will be needed to size up the possibilities.

Sterling Pacific—Calgary wires. Royallie Sterling Pacific No. 4 most recently acidized Turner Valley Crude producer yielded 5.955 barrels according to official reports for the 72 hour period ended 8 a. m. Sunday.

## Prices Drift Lower On Mt'l. Mart

**MONTREAL, June 28**—(AP)—The stock market displayed an uncertain tone in light trading today.

Buyers supported selected utilities and rails but failed to show interest in metals, constructions and papers. Prices in these groups drifted lower.

In the construction group, Foundation sold down a point to 24 and Dominion Steel and Coal 5-8 to 17. United Steel and Gypsum lost 1-8 each with cement off 1-2 and building products up that much.

Major loser in the papers division, Howard Smith dipped 1-3-8 to 27.

Canadian Car common and preferred were up 1-2 each with C.P. R. ahead 1-8 at 12 1-2.

Total stock exchange and curb market sales 88,300 shares; Bonds \$11,600. Mines 64,200 shares; Industrials 24,100 shares.

## Grain

**WINNIPEG, June 28** — (CP)—Spectacular zooming prices followed increasing rust-damage reports from the United States winter wheat belt today, sending wheat futures 4 5-8 to 5 cents higher on the Winnipeg grain exchange.

Lack of moisture and further crop deterioration in Western Canada contributed to the bullish movement in which wheat rose more than six cents from bottom levels July finished at \$1.35 5-8, October \$1.31 1-8 and December \$1.29 1-2.

Liverpool ended irregular trading with losses of 1-4 to 1-2d, influenced partly by increased continental wheat offerings to the United Kingdom. Buenos Aires at noon was 3-8 to 1-2 cent down.

**CHICAGO, June 28**—(AP)—In a late buying stampede today, wheat prices ran up to the extreme immediate permissible limit, five cents a bushel, at most North American markets.

Spring wheat markets led the skyrocketing of values, influenced by spread of black rust northward, and by sensational curtailment of Canadian crop estimates because of drought damage. Some estimates put the probable size of the Canadian crop as low as 150,000,000 bushels, about 50 per cent of expectations a month ago.

At the close, Chicago wheat futures were 3 1-4 to 3 7-8 above Saturday's finish, July 1.18 3-4 to 7-8, Sept. 1.19 7-8 to 1.20, Corn 1 1-8 to 3 3-4 up, July 1.27 to 1.27 1-8, Sept. 1.12 1-2 to 5-8, and oats 1-2 to 2 cents advanced.

## Produce Prices

**MONTREAL, June 28** — (CP)—Prices held fairly steady on Montreal open produce markets today with improvement showing for potatoes.

Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted at 25 cents a dozen for grade A-large, 23 for A-medium, 20 to 20 1-2 for B, and 18 to 18 1-2 for C.

Butter was quoted at 24 to 24 1-2 cents a pound for carlots or less of No. 1 while lots to retailers were 25 cents for solids and 25 1-2 for prints.

Cheese was quoted at 15 to 15 1-4 cents a pound for Ontario while Quebec was at 14 3-8 to 1-2. Potatoes: P. E. I. Mts. No. 1 90's 1.10 to 1.15; No. 2 90's 1.00 to 1.05; N. B. Mts. No. 1 80's 1.00 to 1.10; Que. Mts. No. 1 80's 80 to 85; No. 2 Mts. 80's 70 to 75; new stock, Virginia No. 1 barrels (approx. 170 lbs.) 4.50 to 4.75; No. 2 3.50 to 3.75.

Despite a steady tone in the metal market, the base metal shares were moderately weak. Losses of 3-8 to a point were chalked up for Noranda and Hudson Bay and Sudbury Basin and Sherritt weakened moderately. Silver issues were quiet and steady.

Among the cheaper oils the tone was heavy. Losses of 5 to 20 cents were boarded for Calgary-Edmonton, Home, Dalhousie, Foothills, Okalta, Calmont and Vulcan.
