—TOWN COUNCIL.—The monthly meeting of the Souris Town Council was held in the Council Chambers, Souris, on Dec. 13th. His Worship Mayor Brennan occupied the chair. The councillors present were Messrs. M. A. Paquet, J. B. Matthew, C. D. MacKinnon and Capt. Dominick MacDonald. A number of bills were authorized to be paid amounting to \$125. It was moved by Councillor Paquet and seconded by Councillor Matthew, that \$125 be voted to defray supplement for teachers, which will be due before next meeting, and also that \$25 be voted to defray interest on school debentures due Jan 1st. The following resolution was moved by Councillor Paquet, seconded by Councillor Matthew, that a sum sufficient to pay off firemen as per resolutions drawn up in 1913 and 1914. The Council then adjourned to meet the second Monday in January.—*
