A-large 36 1-2, A-medium 35a, A-pullets B-large 25 1-2a, C 21a. **MONTREAL, Sept. 9 (CP)—**The large volume of butter offerings depressed the price of prints and solids 1-8 cent on open produce markets today according to Dominion Department of Agriculture reports. Demand for potatoes improved substantially and gains of ten cents or less were noted. Offerings of grade "A" eggs continued scarce and A-large prices climbed 1-4 cent. Cheese remained steady. Creamery butter prints to retail dealers sold for 24 1-2-25 cents and creamery solids for 24-24 1-2 cents. Western butter delivered in Montreal was offered at 24 1-2 cents. Quebec No. 1 pasteurized butter in wholesale jobbing lots was 23 3-8-1-2 cents. Cheese sold at 14 1-8-1-4 cents a pound for Ont. white, 14 1-4-3-8 for Ont. colored, 14 for Que. white and 14 1-8 for Que. colored. Graded egg shipments in used free crates sold at 36 1-2-37 cent for A-mediums, 28-30 for pullets, 25 for B and 21 for C. Potatoes: Que. No. 1 80's 50-50; Que. No. 2 70's 40-50; N. B. The SNAPSHOT GUILD
 CAMERA IN THE CAR



When driving, keep your camera on the seat beside you, loaded and ready. You never know when a picture chance (such as this) will pop up.
DO YOU keep your camera in your automobile when you're driving—all loaded on the seat beside you, lens and shutter set, ready to shoot at a moment's notice? Try it sometime, and you'll be surprised how it helps you spot picture opportunities. Hundreds of pictures can be shot without leaving the car. This is especially true in warm weather, when car windows are down, and the top, in some cases, is folded back. If you are not doing the driving, your hands are free and there are many more picture opportunities for you—as well as a better snapshot position. The car halts at a street intersection, and there may be a popcorn peddler on the corner, a window washer at the office window above, people busily hurrying to and from work. A small boy is struggling with a big bundle; an old lady passes by with her head wrapped in a shawl—chance for a well "character" shot. Indeed, all these can be good pictures—natural, "off-guard," full of life. Never take a drive in the country without your camera. You see more, enjoy yourself more, notice more interesting things if the camera is along. Try making a connected picture story of a Sunday afternoon drive—and you'll be surprised how entertaining it can be. And here's an idea: picture landscapes and interesting stretches of road through the windshield of your car, from the back seat, using the outline of the windshield as a "frame" for the scene. Such pictures show not only what you saw, but how you saw it—hence, they are twice as effective. Needless to say, the windshield glass must be clear.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 9 (CP)—All Winnipeg wheat futures closed above the 60-cent mark for the first time in more than a week as they scored net gains of 2 5-8-2 1-2 cents today. Buying was induced by tense political developments in Europe, renewed demand for Canadian wheat, unfavorable harvesting conditions in Alberta and Saskatchewan and higher outside markets. At the close October wheat sold at 60 1-8, November 60 3-8, December 60 1-4 and May 63 7-8 cents. Canadian export sales of wheat and flour soared over the 1,000,000-bushel volume. Transactions in the cash wheat pit improved near the close with mills and exporters taking top northern grades. Spreads closed unchanged except for No. 1 durum which improved 1-2 cent. Short-covering added coarse grains, oats closing 1 7-8-1 1-2 higher, barley 1 5-8-1 3-8 higher, flax 3 3-4-3 1-4 higher and rye 2 3-4-2 1-2 higher. **WINNIPEG, Sept. 9 (CP)—**Closing future quotations wheat—Oct. 60 1-8; Nov. 60 3-8; Dec. 60 1-4; May 63 7-8. Currencies

NEW YORK, Sept. 9 (AP)—The foreign exchange list shriveled under the latest wave of news outlining developments in the Czechoslovak-Sudeten argument many leading currencies equaling or falling below the year's previous bottom quotations. Trading was comparatively light and rates proved susceptible to almost any rumor. The Pound, Sterling lost 7-8 cent to 4.82. French francs dropped .03 1-8 declined .01 1-2 of a cent, the guilder .09 of a cent and the Swiss franc .06 of a cent, the Canadian dollar was
