MARCONI INQUIRY DRAGS SLOWLY

Special Interim Report Dealings With Questions Affecting Ministers.

LONDON, May 3 (Special)—Although the general opinion is that the Marconi inquiry should be ended, the committee seems determined to keep at it. It considered the desirability of presenting a special interim report dealing with questions affecting the Ministers, and came to the conclusion that the time before the rising of Parliament for the White-tide holidays is insufficient to enable them to do so.

However, they decided to conclude the evidence on this part of the inquiry before White-tide and prepare the special interim report immediately after. It is announced by Sir Albert Spicer, chairman, that it has been decided that he and Mr. George Walter Knox, past president of the Institute of Chartered Accountants, should investigate the pass books of Mr. Lloyd George and Sir Rufus Isaacs.

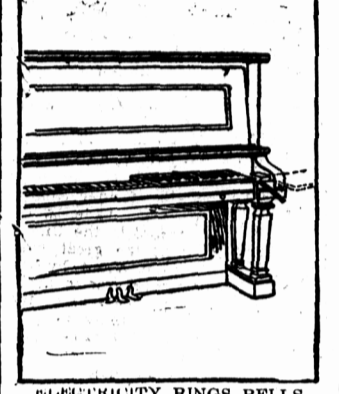
FIDDLES FOR BABIES

Cannot Teach Too Early to Develop Musical Tendencies
The success of the Music School Settlement in New York commands a respectful hearing for the opinions of its founder, Mr. David Mannes, who writes: "Now, I would take a child at 2 1/2 years of age, put a fiddle or a piano in the room, but no teacher, and say: 'Here is a toy. Try to do something with it.'"

"A nurse had a drum; why not a violin? 'Pretty soon the child will say: 'I want a teacher.' That will happen nearly every time. And so with sight singing and reading. The house will not lack a musical atmosphere long if you go about it this way." Compulsory practice for two or three hours a day by an instrument or in voice culture, as Mr. Mannes remarks, certainly has a tendency to kill quickly any love of music with which the ordinary youngster has been born.

BELLS ON THIS PIANO

Auxiliary Keyboard Swings Over Treble of Regular One
That once-popular song Rings on Her Fingers and Bells on Her Toes can be played with the proper accompaniment now that a Wisconsin man has patented a bell attachment for pianos. This attachment consists of an auxiliary keyboard that swings laterally at the right of the piano and can be moved in over the treble of the regular keyboard when wanted.



ELECTRICITY RINGS BELLS
The bass notes on the piano are then played with the left hand, as usual, while the right hand plays the auxiliary keyboard. Electric circuits communicate with the keys of the latter and differently-toned bells are inserted in the circuits. When you strike a key on this attachment, instead of getting a piano note in return you get the sound of a bell, and with a graduated scale of bells you get the same melody in different tones.

VALUE OF WINDBREAKS.

Trees will not only enhance the beauty of surroundings and consequently the value of a farm, but will serve as a protection to crops, orchards, stock, and man, if set out so as to form windbreaks. Fuel, posts, and poles will also be furnished in a few years for the farm. Windbreaks can be formed by a grove of trees, a narrow strip of timber or even a single row of trees set close together. The benefits derived depend upon the density and height of trees, which break the air currents and reduce the velocity of the wind. A belt of evergreen trees surrounding farm buildings and feed yards has a wonderful influence in moderating the winter climate by decreasing the velocity of the wind. Government study and measurements show that a narrow belt of evergreen trees consisting of only two rows, planted close together, and 40 feet high will reduce a 25-mile velocity wind at 200 feet to the leeward to five miles per hour. The reduction is equivalent to raising the temperature 19 degrees as it affects man and beast. This means more comfort for man, saving of fuel in the home, and of feed for the stock. Windbreaks also prevent the drifting of snow around buildings and feed yards. Studies and measurements show that there is considerable increase in yield of fields and orchards sheltered by trees growth. The drying effect upon the soil and crop is decreased by decreasing the velocity of the wind.

OF SPECIAL INTEREST

LONDON, May 1 (Special)—"Liar!" "Scoundrel!" "Coward!" were expressions used by Mr. Winston S. Churchill, denouncing the flimsy gossip connecting him with the deals in Marconi shares at the meeting of the Parliamentary committee here. The First Lord of the Admiralty was obviously angry that any one should have connected his name with the dealings, and he did not hesitate to tell the committee what he thought of its action in summoning him as a witness.

Mr. Churchill's name had been mentioned earlier in the proceedings, by Mr. Ellis T. Powell, editor of the Financial News, who stated he had heard Mr. Churchill's name as that of one Cabinet Minister who had been dealing in Marconi shares, the witness adding that he regarded the rumor as absolutely without foundation. After an indignant denial of the rumor that he had dealt in Marconi shares, Mr. Churchill said: "It is a most insulting charge and implies that I have been skulking in the background while my colleagues have come forward and explained their position. It is grave beyond words that a committee of my fellow members of the House of Commons should have thought it right to lend their sanction to the putting of such questions to me. 'I have had no dealing directly or indirectly nor any investment or interest in any kind in Marconi shares in any country of the inhabited globe. Anybody who said so is a liar and a slanderer and the person who repeated such a statement and stated that he believed it to be false is a coward.' Mr. Churchill then left the room apparently as indignant as when he entered it.
