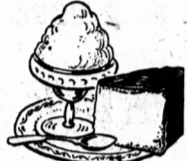

Mayonnaise



3 tablespoonsful Borden's Evaporated Milk, undiluted; 1/2 teaspoonful salt; 1/4 teaspoonful pepper; 1/4 teaspoonful mustard; 2 tablespoonsful sharp vinegar; 1/4 cupful salad oil—any kind. Combine the seasonings, add the milk, and gradually beat in the oil with an egg beater. Then whip in the vinegar. Use as any Mayonnaise. Transfer to covered jar, keeps well in a cool place.

Orange Cream Sherbet



1 cupful Borden's Evaporated Milk; 3 cupfuls water; 1 1/2 cupfuls sugar; 1/2 cupful lemon juice; 1/2 cupful orange juice. Boil the sugar and water together for five minutes. Chill and add the fruit juices. Freeze slightly in three parts ice to one part salt, then add the evaporated milk and finish freezing.

One Egg Cake



1/4 cup Borden's diluted with 1/4 cup cold water; 1/4 cup vegetable cooking oil; 1/2 cup sugar; 1 egg; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder; 1 cup barley flour; 1/2 cup cornstarch; 1/2 teaspoon vanilla; 1/2 teaspoon lemon extract. Beat egg light and cream with sugar, salt and flavorings. Combine milk diluted, with cooking oil. Sift dry ingredients together and add alternately to first mixture with the milk. Beat thoroughly, turn into lined, medium-sized pan, sprinkle nut meats, chopped raisins or coconut over top. Bake in moderate oven.

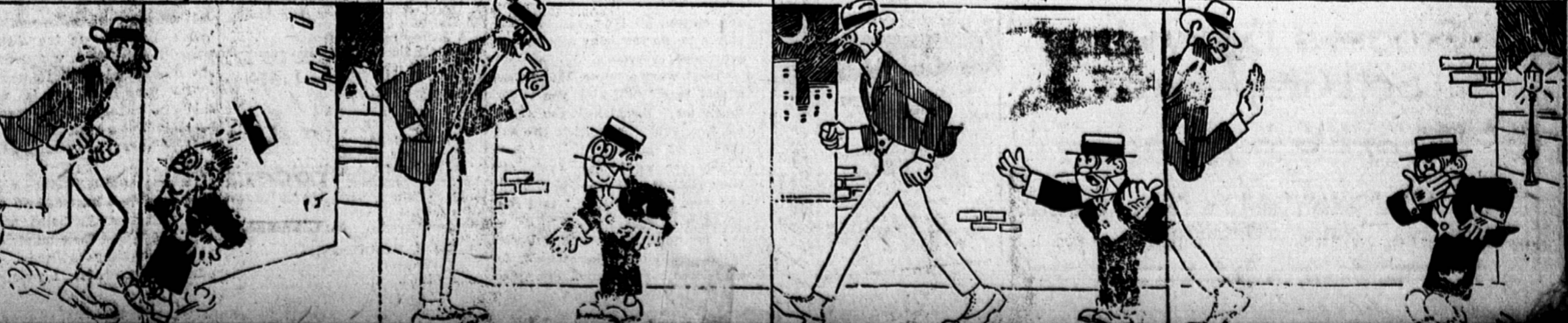
