PROVINCIAL PROHIBITION.

The Examiner finds several objections to provincial prohibition, one of which touches the greatest difficulty that lies in the way of the proposed measure.

Two other points are raised by the Examiner, the first of which we can hardly take seriously. It is this in substance: If certain province or provinces should adopt provincial prohibition and by that means avoid altogether the payment of either excise or customs duties, might not other provinces in which liquor would still be imported and manufactured, and which would be paying duties on liquors—

The Examiner also raises the question of compensation to those in the liquor trade for the destruction of their business. In regard to this matter those in the traffic may as well set their minds at rest. The majority of the people in Canada will never consent to the so-called compensation.

No doubt when prohibition, either by provinces or by a general law is brought in, the big distillers and brewers will make a fight for compensation, but they will not get it.

Those engaged in distilling, brewing, wholesaling or retailing intoxicants will have had timely notice. Let them set their houses and their business in order. Prohibition is coming, slowly, but none the less surely, and it is coming without any clog of compensation attached to it.

There are various estimates of the probable output of gold from the Klondike this spring ranging from \$12,000,000 to \$20,000,000. Probably the lower figures are nearest correct.

There was much discussion in the press and on the platform during the recent election campaign in New Brunswick over the charge that the Emmerson government had paid two or three prices for a number of steel bridges which they had constructed during two or three years past.

It seems a little unkind of the Examiner to sneer at the proposed tunnel under the Straits. The tunnel scheme was a perfectly practicable one, the only obstacle being its cost.
