**LETTER OF SYMPATHY**

Dear Mrs. Vessey, York.

It is well nigh possible for me to convey to you in writing, expression of my profound sorrow for the loss you have suffered in your brother's death. Nelson and I were together with the first Brigade—he was a staff Sergt. and I was a signaller. He was simply splendid I never heard of him making a mistake. General Mercer and his staff looked upon your brother as being their right hand man. At first we had practically no precedent to go by. Everything had to be done according to local requirements. We were on the move a great deal from place to place. He would go on ahead and when the General arrived he had only to walk into his office; everything was in working order.

When the 3rd Division was formed General Mercer insisted that Nelson was to go with him. I always used to go and see him whenever I was passing 3rd Division headquarters and we would exchange island news.

I remember well once when we were at "Plug Street" during the summer of 1915 he told me that he did so wish to get more active duty and that he was going to apply for a commission in the marching gun corps. He did this and was refused as there was no one to take his place.

You have the consolation of knowing that there never was a finer all round man, a thoroughly conscientious worker and one who had the love and respect of all with whom he came in contact.

I have lost a friend whom I was looking forward to meeting again and to talk over many happy times. He has made the sacrifice after four years of service and when the end was well in sight, I trust that the knowledge of the excellent life that Nelson lived and of his death in action may help you in your bereavement.

This is very broken and feeble but I do hope you will understand.
