REPEAL OF NEUTRALITY ACT IS AIM Move to Furnish Additional Aid to the Allies Begins in Congress.

WASHINGTON, June 13.—(AP)—Reports that "excellent progress" is being made toward extending material aid by the United States to the Allies in planes, munitions and possibly old destroyers were heard in Washington today as a move began in Congress to repeal the Neutrality Act.

Turkey Trades Tobacco For Nazis Machinery

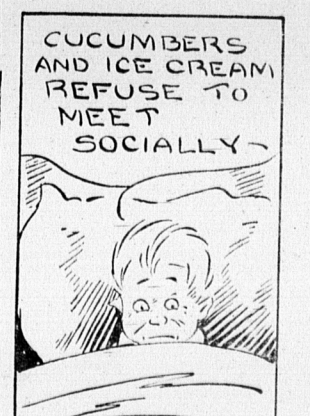


Table with weather forecasts for Toronto and other cities, including minimum and maximum temperatures.
