THE REGISTRATION PLAN.—The registration of every resident of Canada of 16 years of age and over, which is to be made next Saturday, is to be undertaken in order that the Dominion may have complete and accurate information as to the measure of its human resources. The war situation makes it imperative that from every Canadian there must come the utmost in service. Anything less than the exertion of the country's maximum effort must mean that the Dominion is not bearing its whole share of the war burden, and if victory over Prussianism is to be won and the world is to remain free it can only be the employment of the maximum strength of every one of the Allied countries; the events of recent weeks have demonstrated the truth of that statement. Registration, as an Ottawa despatch has pointed out, is a necessary preliminary to the use of Canada's full power "for the reason that a country can not exert its full strength in any enterprise unless it determines beforehand the measure of that strength." There are penalties attaching to failure to register next Saturday, but it is patriotism and sense of duty, and not the fear of penalties, that will cause every good citizen to act upon the registration order. There will be reason to doubt the loyalty of anyone who deliberately fails to comply with that order.—Ex.

FROM THE WEST INDIES.—The schooner Silver Queen from Barbados with a full cargo of molasses for De Blois Bros., arrived in Charlottetown early yesterday morning after a fairly rough voyage. She left Barbados about the first of May and made an excellent run until she encountered stormy weather off the Nova Scotia Coast as the result of which she was delayed for some time at Liscombe, N. S. The Silver Queen is now discharging her cargo at the Steam Navigation Wharf and will afterwards proceed to New York.

AN EARLY FIRE.—The firemen had an early morning call out yesterday, the alarm sounding about 2 o'clock for a blaze at Brighton. When they arrived at the scene of the fire they found that it was confined to a small building used as a chicken house on the premises of Mr. W. A. Stewart, Greenfield Avenue. It was some time after the fire was discovered before Mr. Stewart could manage to get in, and when the firemen arrived after a record breaking run, it was to find the little structure a mass of flames which they soon extinguished. The fire is believed to have started from an oil lamp which must have become over-heated or exploded, and which was being utilized in connection with a brooder with young chicks. The hen house was a new one, and was not quite completed. Nearly two hundred young chicks lost their lives when it went up in the flames.

NEARLY A FIRE.—The practice of small fires in Charlottetown lighting small fires along the sides of streets and in backyards and gangways is becoming all too common and is fraught with great danger. A serious fire from this cause nearly happened last Sunday when boys lit a fire in a gangway off Dorchester street to the rear of Mr. Murray's bakery. A woman who happened to be passing noticed the fire and gave the alarm, and it was extinguished with a few pails of water. This fire was set in a place where the buildings are all of wood and very close together, and which if got any sort of a start might easily wipe out the whole block as happened in the same section a good many years ago. It is said that the setting of bon-fires is quite a hobby among certain boys of that part of the town especially, and the sooner their parents or someone in authority over them take it upon themselves to look after them the better for all concerned.
