Unfair discrimination against Kings County during years of Liberal rule in the matter of public works expenditures was strikingly shown by Hon. John A. MacDonald, M. P. in the course of his address at the King's County Conservative Association meeting at Georgetown on Wednesday. Mr. MacDonald proved convincingly that despite economic depression and the need of providing the most rigid economy, the Bennett Government had done much more for the county than its predecessors, and this year the public works expenditure is nearly fifty times as great as was made during the year 1927, in a period of boisterous prosperity.

Mr. MacDonald's explanation of this matter elicited the warmest applause, and the figures which he gave proved a revelation in the way of contrast between the attitudes of the parties toward the interests of King's County.

### Big Increase In Ry. Tonnage On Island Division

Phenomenal Pickup In Railway Business Reported From Superintendent MacKinnon's Office.

An increase in freight tonnage of 13,619 tons in October this year over the same month last year is reported by the Island Division of the Canadian National Railway. The number of automobiles ferried by the S. S. Charlottetown also showed a remarkable increase this year. In 1933 in the months from May to October inclusive, 4,685 automobiles were ferried from Tormentine to Borden, as against 5,401 during the same period this year. From Borden to Tormentine in 1933 4,579 automobiles were ferried and during the same period this year 5,331. Potato and turnip shipments by rail during October and September this year also increased. During the past two months potato shipments have increased 226 cars and turnip shipments 25 cars over a corresponding period last year.

LONDON, Nov. 8.—Labor motion for the abolition of private manufacture and trade in armaments was defeated in the House of Commons tonight. The vote was 279 to 88.
