NEW YORK, May 21 (AP)—The Netherlands guilder veered off on another track in yesterday's foreign exchange dealings.
A loss of .04 of a cent by the guilder to 53.78 in terms of the United States dollar capped a week of erratic fluctuations. The Swiss franc moved narrowly ahead while the pound sterling, French franc and belge were unchanged. The pound was at 4.68 1-8 and the franc at 2.64 15-16. Canadian funds were at a discount of 23-64 compared with 11-32 Friday.

Cherry Royal

1 package lemon jelly
1 cup hot water
1 cup pineapple juice
1 cup crushed pineapple, drained
1 cup whipping cream
12 maraschino cherries
Method: Dissolve the jelly powder in the boiling water. Drain the juice from the pineapple and add enough of the liquid from the cherries to make 1 cup. If there isn't sufficient of this, fill the cup with cold water. Stir until the jelly powder is dissolved, then set aside until it begins to thicken.
Beat with a rotary egg beater until the mixture is light and foamy then fold in the stiffly whipped cream and the well drained pineapple. Cut the cherries in quarters and pat between towels to dry. Fold these in, mixing well and turn into a mould that has been oiled and lined with cold water.
Chill until perfectly firm, then unmould and serve on chilled glass plates, topped with a spoonful of whipped cream. The jelly will be fluffy and light textured, not firm, but very cool and refreshing and mighty good to eat.
