Bitter Aerial Battle Over Germany

Allies Meet Opposition In Big Raid

LONDON, March 31—(AP)—The most bitter aerial battle of the war was fought in moonlit skies over Germany and occupied Europe last night as British and Canadian bombers pounded the Nazi strongholds of Nuremberg with 2,400 short tons of bombs. The raid cost the record total of 94 planes, including 13 Canadian.
