An Oshawa Case Which Puzzled the Local Doctors as Well as Those at the Hospital in Toronto.

OSHAWA, Ont., Oct. 20th.—(Special)—Five years ago Mr. Joseph Brown, of the Oshawa Malleable Iron Works, began to feel a stiffness and soreness in the calves of his legs. AUSTRIAN PARLIAMENT AGAIN PERTURBED.
VIENNA, Oct. 22.—A free fight between Czechs and Germans in the reichsrath today was only averted by the president suspending the session. The Germans, angered by a long drawn speech by a Czech deputy, invited the president to suppress him, and when he declined Herr Berger, leaders of the Pan-German party, shouted to the Czechs: "You are blackguards."

The Czechs thereupon sprang to their feet and advanced to attack them, but the president's action cooled their ardor.

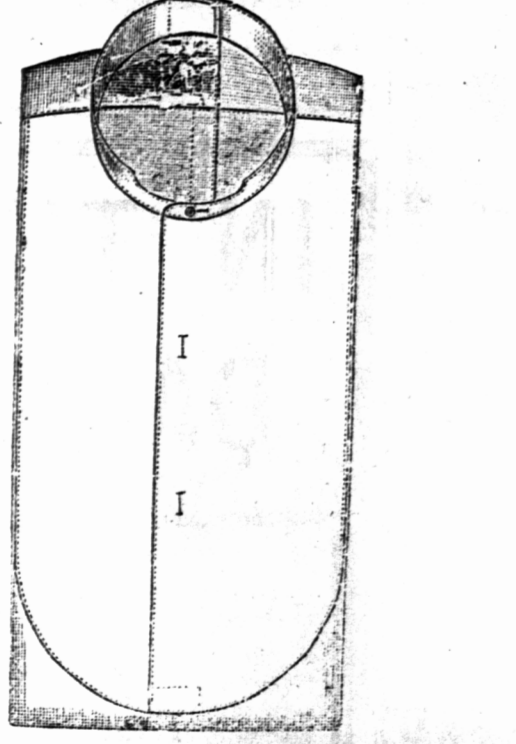
