Schooner Minnie O'Toole has arrived from P. E. Island and brought the news that potatoes are selling there at 50 cents per bus, wholesale. Citizens for that reason must rely on the supplies furnished by the farmers of the surrounding country, who have now the chance to get good prices for their tubers, not having to contend with P. E. I. competition.—Louisbourg Ex.

After forty-eight years as a minister of the gospel, the last twenty of which were spent in Nutley, Rev. W. I. Stuart of the Reformed Church tendered his resignation last Sunday morning. Mr. Stuart has been contentedly declining to have an assistant. Many of his congregation desired that the latter course be taken, but the aged minister declined claiming a better man could be secured if he was given full charge. At the meeting of the Classis of Newark on Wednesday the local consistory (G. A. Hill, S. S. C. Cuanan, Newton Woodruff and Freeman Kline, appeared and made known Mr. Stuart's wishes. He was retired and made pastor emeritus. His successor has not yet been selected, and Mr. Stuart will continue his work until the appointment is made. Several applications have been received for the position. Many expressions of the laity's work and profound influence of the retiring minister were made by the other pastors in the body. One of the members remarking on the passing of the oldest minister in point of service in the body, said it was the "most ideal resignation he had ever witnessed." In the course of his pastorate of fifty years Mr. Stuart has seen many fields of endeavor. From a charge in Warwick, Bermuda, he went to West Point, Prince Edward Island, Fredericton, N. B.; Hamilton, Green Hill, N. S.; and West St. John, N. B., before from the latter place to Nutley in 1850. This town was then a manufacturing centre with about 1,300 inhabitants. The church grew greatly after Mr. Stuart assumed control. On June 26 of this year he celebrated the twentieth anniversary of his installation as pastor here. During last year the fiftieth anniversary of the building of the church was celebrated.—Nutley (N. J.) Sun.

A correspondent writing from Alberton states in this Province that "many P. E. Island people would appreciate the convenience much more were they to send a few months in an outlying district to the West. I have met more than one eastern school teacher, who told me that when it rained he had to shift his bed about from one part of his boarding house to another, according to the direction in which the wind was blowing. Is it any wonder you meet with so many people in the west who are crippled with rheumatism? There are many homesteads on the prairies whose first experience in cooling was when hunger forced them to try their hand at the art. Naturally the results are just about what one might expect. Having become familiar with the conditions of a number of teachers, I can readily understand (though I have never studied medicine) why so many people in the prairie province are dyspeptics. Again in the east we used to think six or seven miles rather great a distance to be away from a doctor, but in the west there are some settled districts that have not got a physician within sixty or seventy miles of them. I have known of persons in serious physical conditions being taken by their friends a distance of sixty miles over a very rough road to the nearest hospital. This is partly why so many common ailments and accidents end fatally. Another disadvantage in this country is the very high cost of living. A friend once told me that one could get as much value for a dollar in Charlottetown as for two in a western town and this I have found to be pretty nearly the case. I have given you only one side of the story as in my opinion the justice has been done to the other side by land speculators, railway companies and others."

It would not take a runner like Thomas long to look up all his relatives and friends on the tight little island, even should they be as widely scattered as the shores will permit.

The following from a Sydney Exchange will interest all who handle money as well as give a word to the wise: Bankers, merchants and others have been noticing that of late there has been a great deal of counterfeit coin in circulation about the city. Half dollars, quarters and smaller silver pieces have made their appearance in large quantities, and the imitation is so good that it is hard even for experts to detect the counterfeit. The money is mostly in United States coins, and it is thought that there is a regular band of counterfeiters throughout the Maritime Provinces who are "shoving the queer." This belief is strengthened by the fact that the counterfeiters have made their appearance in Halifax, St. John, Moncton and other cities of the provinces.

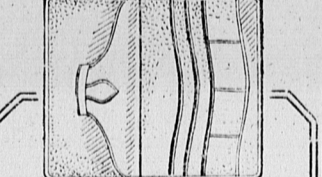
