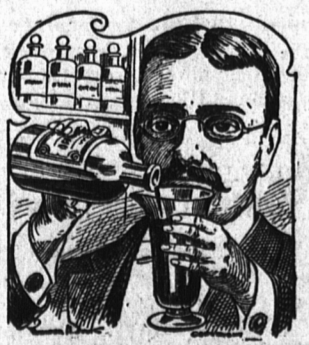

The summer sailings of the Plant Line from Charlottetown will commence June 20th, when the S. S. "Olivette" will leave every Tuesday and the S. S. "Halifax" every Friday at 1 p. m.

The remains of the late Miss Charlotte P. Montgomery will arrive this evening from New York. The funeral service will be held in the church at Princetown tomorrow, Saturday, at 1 p. m.

H. J. GORDON of the Bank of Nova Scotia, North-Sydney, and Mrs. Gordon arrived this week on a visit to the former's home in Alberton. They will visit Charlottetown before leaving for the mainland on Monday next.

MISS VIOLET GOLDSMITH, who graduated from the U. N. B. at the last convocation, leaves shortly for Verna, near Regina, where she purposes entering the teaching profession. Miss Goldsmith is also a graduate of P. W. College.

JOSEPH H. GAY who has conducted a meat market on Kent street and in the market for some time past, has sold his business to his brother Vernon Gay, who is now prepared with a good supply of meat to cater to the store's old customers and many new ones.

The demand for "Tunnel" stamps has been so great that the supply is exhausted. An effort is being made to secure several thousand more, and in the meantime all orders to hand will be held. The steamer Richard, in berth at the Halifax Coal company's wharf, Halifax, is being overhauled and her upper seams caulked. After this work is completed the Richard will go on the marine slip and have a couple of planks removed and replaced with new ones. The Richard's bow planks were badly cut by ice last winter.

Rev. J. C. ROBERTSON, B. D., of Milltown, N. B., was unanimously appointed the Presbyterian Assembly Sabbath School Secretary with headquarters at Toronto. The salary, clear of office and travelling expenses, will be \$1500 a year. The motion to appoint him was supported by Dr. Robt. Murray, Principal Falconer and others in very appreciative addresses. Mr. Robertson is a gold medalist from McGill, and also from the Presbyterian College, in Montreal.

Rev. J. B. CHAMPTON of Harcourt, Kent Co., passed through Sackville last evening on his way to Bayfield. He will spend a day there before crossing to the Island to attend conference which opens in Charlottetown. The reverend gentleman, who has been supplying the Harcourt Circuit since October, has been asked to remain another year as regular pastor, and has consented. Mr. Champton was formerly stationed at Bayfield—Sackville Post, 13th.

THE C. P. R. will issue tickets from points in Quebec and Ontario to Charlottetown for the Home Comers' Carnival on the certificate plan. Passengers to be issued one way tickets to Charlottetown, and furnished at the time of purchase with standard railway convention certificate, which upon being properly filled out and signed by the secretary will be honored by ticket agents at Charlottetown, for ticket to return to starting point free, provided 300 have been in attendance at the celebration, holding standard certificates showing railway fare paid on the going journey. If less than 300, and 50 or more in attendance, the return will be free to Montreal, and one third of the one way fare from Montreal to the starting point. If less than fifty in attendance and over ten, return will be free to Montreal, plus two-thirds the one way fare from Montreal to starting point.

The Plant line have decided to equip both their steamers with wireless telegraphy, and when completed the steamers will be in communication with their offices at Boston, Halifax, Hawkesbury and Charlottetown, the entire voyage. The wireless land stations on the United States coast and at Campdown are now working, and it is expected that the station at Charlottetown will be installed during July. The steamer Olivette has already been fitted up and will have an operator on board, but until Canadian stations are completed she will be only able to communicate with United States stations. The Halifax will be fitted up later on after the Canadian stations are completed. The Plant line steamers will be the first coastwise steamers out of Halifax to become equipped with wireless telegraphy, and it will undoubtedly be advantageous to passengers travelling to have constant communication with the terminal ports during the voyage.—Halifax Herald.
