Creation Of New British War Medal

LONDON, May 18.—(CP Cable) Creation of seven medals for which Britain's servicemen and women may qualify was announced tonight.

Except the recently-announced Burma star, all are new awards. It was announced that the King had created the medals for service in Britain and all war theatres.

Six are campaign stars, including one reserved for air crews, and the seventh is a defence medal for non-operational military service.

They are: the Atlantic Star, the Air Crew Europe Star, the Italy Star, the France and Germany Star, the Pacific Star, the Burma Star and the Defence Medal.

Prime Minister Churchill will make a statement in the House of Commons tomorrow giving details of the new stars and the defence medal, the Press Association's court correspondent said, and the announcement listing the necessary qualifications for the awards will be made "very shortly."

disclosed that the defence medal will be for "military non-operational service overseas from the country of residence and for specific service in the United Kingdom and other territories which have been subjected to air attack or closely threatened."

Whether this service "overseas from country of residence" includes Canadians and other empire troops who left home to serve elsewhere was not known but probably it will be made clear in the official details.
