May Shift Venue Of League of Nations

PARIS, Nov. 29.—A determination to shift leadership in the proposed League of Nations, as provided by the Treaty of Versailles, from American to European hands, will be made when the various societies favoring the League plan convene in Brussels December 1, it was believed here today. France, it was pointed out, particularly desires to have a more prominent place in the direction of the proposed League's affairs. Many of the French ideas for a League failed to be incorporated in the Peace Conference's covenant, owing to opposition to President Wilson and the French, in view of the American Senate's opposition to the covenant, feel they deserve another chance to get a League which will satisfy what they consider France's needs.

Belgium also was expected to start a fight for removal of the Capital of the League from Geneva to Brussels. The Belgians made a hard fight during the Peace Conference to have their Capital chosen as the League's seat, but were over-ruled. DUE TO SENATE ACTION. The greatest importance was attached to the fact that the convention of the European League societies will precede the initial meeting of the Peace Conference's League, which has not yet been called by President Wilson. Politicians foresaw in the Brussels gathering—ostensibly to further organization of the League as provided by the Peace Treaty—a possible move to hasten organization of machinery for a league which may be considerably different from that provided by the Conference's covenant. With America temporarily removed from leadership in the League plan because of the Senate's rejection of

the Treaty and the League covenant, it was believed possible the Brussels convention may mark the passing of League leadership from America to Europe.

"LO, THE RICH INDIAN" NOW.

OTTAWA, Nov. 29.—"Lo! the rich Indian," is how we shall have to quote Pope's lines in the near future. The total of the Indian trust fund derived from the sale of lands belonging to the wards of Canada at one time or another since the creation of the Department of Indian Affairs now amounts to over eleven million dollars. The Inspector of Indian Agencies has been in Ottawa, recently together with W. Govan, Inspector and valuator of lands for the Soldiers Land Settlement Board making arrangements for the transfer to further lands to the value of one million dollars situated in the three western provinces for the purpose of soldiers' settlement.

Col. W. W. Foster of the Department of Soldiers Civil Re-establishment has just returned from the west where he has been looking into the whole matter of soldiers re-establishment. He will make a report to the Government next week when it is understood he will have some important recommendations to make concerning different enterprises which the Government may undertake for the benefit of the soldier during the coming winter.
