 Work around the P. E. I. Railway shops at present is very brisk. Among the much other work is the building of fifty or more box cars. New brick mechanical offices are to be built on Water Street, adjoining the stores, and a new warehouse on the railway wharf 250 feet long, and 7 feet wide, which will rest on a pile foundation. It is possible also that 15 miles of track on the P. E. Island Railway will be laid with new steel rails, heavier than those at first laid down. Already four miles have been laid. 150 tons have been distributed along the line, with 100 tons yet at Pictou.
