HOW TO MAKE A TASSEL.

It's the simplest thing in the world to make your own tassels for trimming, finishing off sashes, bags, and so on, and so much more satisfactory than buying them because you are sure of a perfect color match and much more personality in the tassel you make yourself.

The easiest way is to take a piece of cardboard just a little longer than you wish your tassel to be and wind your silk or wool or chenille round and round the cardboard, keeping the strands from overlapping as much as possible.

You can pull the strands around at the top where they are caught with the tied thread so that they make a nice round head, and a half-inch or so below this you can wind a matching or contrasting thread. A loop for your tassel may be crocheted on to the top for a fastening.

Strands of contrasting silk or wool or cotton can be wound into the tassel over the cardboard before the ends are slashed. Beads can be knotted into the strand that winds the tassel into a head at the top.

The professional way to make a tassel is over a wooden mold to be bought for the purpose but unless the tassel is large and to be used conspicuously or destined for hard wear the other simpler kind is just as attractive.

All sorts of materials can be fashioned into attractive tassels. Beads make lovely tassels, the small beads strung for the strands—though, in this case each strand will have to be strung and knotted separately—and larger beads for the top; wool, chenille, silk, cotton, braid, string, raffia, even straw and leather will sometimes give just the touch you have been looking for to finish off the home-made frock or fancy bag.
