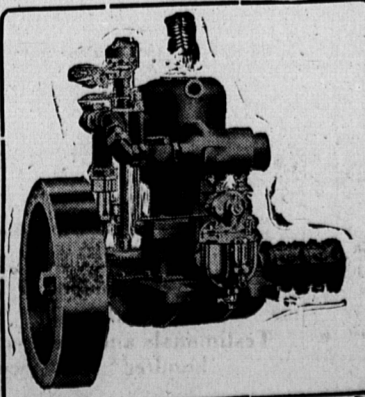

Through their organizations they should let the Government know their views on these matters in order that legislation may be based upon at least some of them. For trappers the number is fascinating as it gives interesting accounts of many big meets and numerous smaller ones, showing the importance attached to this branch of sport throughout the Dominion.
