THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

The Sabbath Question.

Sir,—It may be that on some points the country can be an illumination to the town. I am glad to add a line from Georgetown to the letter which already appeared from Cardigan, commending your firm stand on the Sabbath question. We may remind you, Mr. Editor, that it was to the East that men formerly looked for light. But you may be sure that you would have on your side amongst men no less a personage than the "preacher" President of the United States, who only a few weeks ago exposed a less flagrant violation than that you complain of: "It is," he said to the photographer, "a despicable thing for you thus to violate the Sabbath."

We not only condemn new phases of the sapping and mining process, but we lament the concession already made to the demands of a supposed necessity. The last time I preached in Charlottetown I thought it my duty to remonstrate against the opening of your Post Office on Sunday for the delivery of the mails, and the consequent mixing together on that day of things that differ. A law of natural philosophy is to the effect that two bodies cannot occupy the same space,—true, I presume, of mind as well as matter. The upward pull of two or three religious hours a week, is not enough to counteract the downward pull of seven days of a flood of secular newspaper.

And every winter we see no necessity in the world for the running of the mail and passenger train from Charlottetown to Georgetown on Sabbath nights, when a train early Monday morning would reach the outgoing steamers in time.
