Beasley Says Brough Better Tennis Player Than Marble

By Gayle Talbot Associated Press Staff Writer NEW YORK, Aug. 25—(AP)—The scholarly Mercer Beasley says, without batting an eye, that the United States already has developed a better woman tennis player in 19-year-old Louise Brough than Alice Marble was when she turned professional two seasons ago.

Beasley, perhaps the best known tennis coach in the land, practically jumped at a chance to express his opinion of Louise's address while he watched her and several score other players practice at Forest Hills for the U. S. national championship starting Thursday. His statement was on the starting line, inasmuch as Miss Marble was in a class by herself for the last few years of her amateur career and some competent judges thought she belonged in the same "all time" category with Helen Wills Moody and Suzanne Lenglen. Miss Brough, on the other hand, was only a Juniper for last year and was ranked No. 10 among U. S. women players.

"Forget what she was last year," Beasley insisted. "Right now she is better than any player ever developed so fast. She has won every tournament she has entered this summer, and she will win here, too."

"She has everything, including three different services and a fine net game. Equally important, she has the ability to hit her own ability—newly tried, according to the can't make. And to top it all, she has youth and all the stamina in the world."
