The Boston Bruins, battered and bruised, after three games and three railway jumps in four days are resting until Saturday.

Ray Schalk is said to be slated to succeed Grover Land as coach with the Chicago Cubs. The former White Sox catcher and later manager is still an idol of the Windy City fans.

Art Gagne, who was sent to Boston in a trade last spring and for whose return the Montreal experts were howling loud and long before Canadiens got going this season, has been let out by the Bruins.

Ingomar Grattan, 2.05, won that three-cornered matched race at Dufferin Park, Toronto, over Lady Helen and Black Scott. The fastest time was 2.11 1-4 in the first heat, just an even second slower than the track record, but the last half was in 1.05.

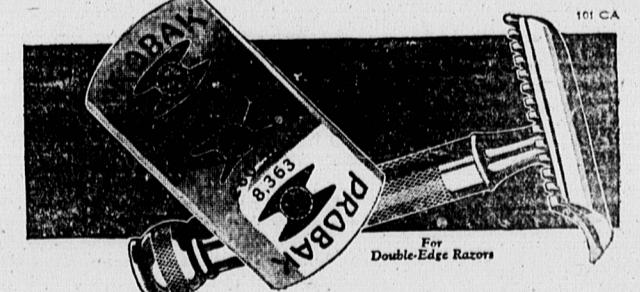
