A FALSE REPORT—The Sunnyside Farmer published a rather disconcerting and inaccurate report of a slight collision which occurred recently between cars driven by Dr. Leo Frank, Charlottetown and Mr. T. D. Ramsay of St. John's, Summerside. The report in somewhat sarcastic tones places the blame upon Dr. Frank and endeavors to include in the charge a case now before the courts. It accuses the doctor of discourteous language to Mr. Ramsay all of which, as well as the account of the collision, is absolutely without foundation and no doubt the work of a highly imaginative and irresponsible amateur. Mr. Ramsay, who is a gentleman, in a letter to Dr. Frank regrets the publication of the report in question and states that he had personally requested the Summerside paper to make no mention of the accident as those concerned in it were perfectly satisfied that no blame attached to either and that the settlement of the matter was made in the most amicable manner. Meantime the doctor expresses the opinion that those who were "sickened" were the ones who were disappointed in receiving a donation from him through the Summerside court, to help pave the Summerside streets. In any case he says he is satisfied that he has accomplished something in the fact that, since his appeal of the case brought against him, no charges have been laid against any other motorists in the town for speeding.
