Rousing Address By W-Comdr. McLean D.F.C.

Following are excerpts from an address last night by Wing Commander J. Angus MacLean, D.F.C., Progressive Conservative candidate for Queens.

"For more than five years we in common with the other Allied Nations of the world under the leadership of such men as Winston Churchill and the late President Roosevelt, have been fighting to demonstrate once again the age old truth that right and decency and fair dealing will win out in the end. We, as members of a democracy, have refused to be browbeaten and intimidated by world powers who sought to rob us of our freedom for the benefit of small groups or individuals.

"However, we have not finished the job. There are tendencies at home to attempt to distract our attention from the real issues which are facing us with regard to our national problems. An example of these tactics is the calling of a by-election in the Cardigan District at an unsuitable season before the service men returned and cease their franchise and when the country is involved in a federal election. It was hoped that political advantage could be gained by holding this election at a time when it was imagined the people of the Cardigan District were still unaware of the fact that the people of Canada have realized that a new era demands a new Prime Minister. The people of Cardigan yesterday elected the Progressive Conservative Candidate, Major MacDonald, and demonstrated once again that the tactics of putting political expediency ahead of the country's interest, have fallen into disrepute with you and me who are determined that our votes will be cast in the interests of our country.

"The people of Ontario have also given their answer yesterday, in no uncertain terms, to the Liberal and C.F.P. Parties in the Ontario Provincial Election. They have pointed the way to us with regard to next Monday's Election.

Family Allowances

"Another example of these tactics is provided by a pamphlet which is published by the National Liberal Federation and which is being mailed to you and me. This pamphlet states that the Family Allowance Bill was passed through by the Liberals against Tory opposition. The people who produced this pamphlet have greatly underestimated our intelligence. You and I know very well that every major party in the House of Commons voted in favour of the Family Allowance. We know that the Family Allowance Act is already law and no party has any notion of repealing that law. We know too that every major party is pledged, if elected, to the continued payment of family allowances.

"Knowing these things, we, of course, refuse to be misled regardless of whether we have a family or not the majority of us will back Bracken on June 11th, and demonstrate to the Canadian people, on that day, that the Canadian people can not be scared away from voting in their country's interests.

SERIOUS BACON SITUATION

Sir—Your editorial in Friday's *Guardian* and the two excellent letters last week and in Saturday's *Guardian* from the pen of Mr. J. A. Gillies draw attention to a very serious situation not only in the supply of bacon to Great Britain but in the future of the whole hog industry in Prince Edward Island.

Apparently expecting the farmers of Canada to maintain the production of hogs during the present year to last year's standard, Ottawa proposed Great Britain supply of bacon during 1945 even larger than that of 1944. For reasons which Ottawa evidently did not foresee the farmers of Canada during the first four months of the present year slackened their efforts resulting in a shrinkage of one less than 10% in the supply of hogs, nor is there any knowledge what is going to happen during the balance of the year.

The latest news from Great Britain is that the government has already reduced the bacon ration by 25%. Bacon in Britain is almost universally served as part of the daily breakfast, a fact that we in this country scarcely appreciate. Not only, therefore, is the personal sacrifice great but Britain is very anxious to assist the starving people of the European nations now released from German control.

Under the circumstances it should be but reasonable that the farmers of Canada will make a special effort during 1946 and 1947 to satisfy the demands of the Mother Country.

It may be contended that Prince Edward Island is but a small contributor in the hog market. Our output was somewhere from 66,000 to 70,000 of which only half was shipped to Britain, the balance being processed by Davis & Fraser and supplied for home consumption.

The three Prairie Provinces, particularly Saskatchewan and Alberta, have been the chief source of Canadian supply and hence are today the principal defaulters. In those provinces there are many farmers of foreign origin who naturally have not the same sympathy or sense of duty towards the Mother Country that our farmers have in Prince Edward Island. When the price of wheat is high they naturally feel inclined to grow rather than from tending livestock, particularly in the winter months. The farmers of the west in fact close their houses for the winter and travel west of the conditions are very similar to those in Prince Edward Island. Our winter climate is much more moderate and our farmers are more knowledgeable of animal husbandry as shown in their success in fox raising and in the raising of horses and cattle. To these reasons can be added the fact that in the raising of hogs the highest type Prince Edward Island has given a decided lead to the other provinces of the Dominion. In a bulletin issued by the Ontario Government with regard to the average percentage of Grade A bacon hogs throughout the Dominion is as follows:

British Columbia	32.2
Alberta	27.5
Saskatchewan	27.5
Manitoba	30
Ontario	37.8
Quebec	31.9
3 Maritimes	44.2

I am told that the Island percentage is well above 44.2.

This is a situation of which the farmers of Prince Edward Island have every reason to be proud. This fact also it is evident that our farmers are in a position to establish a permanent trade in bacon, the highest quality of bacon providing they act quickly as explained in Mr. Gillies' letter.

In the potato industry our farmers have won the reputation of producing the best potatoes on the continent, particularly in the north and there is no reason to suppose that they cannot establish an even more important industry in bacon. To accomplish this most desirable result there will need to be the strongest cooperation not only among the farmers themselves but also on the part of the Prince Edward Island Government who will need in some cases to assist financially and in many cases to

Health Service

"In view of the inadequate medical and hospital services now prevailing in many rural districts, due to unfavourable economic conditions, we shall co-operate with the Provinces with a view to planning and keeping the health service functioning and classifying all lands in farms or likely to be farmed, so that the best cropping practices may be developed.

Veterans' Security

"To provide security for veterans who have sacrificed economic advantage by serving in the armed forces, the Progressive Conservative Party is pledged to payment of adequate pensions, increased assistance to veterans in urban areas to enable them to own their homes, to assist in the purchase of land to help veterans to establish themselves in business, full consultation with veterans associations on all matters of interest, and a complete re-drafting of the Pensions Act so that those who have become disabled during the period of their service, whether on duty or not, will be provided for under the Pensions Act and so that the pensions of the widows of the fallen are adequate to support them and their families.
