A TORONTO despatch of April 17th says:—A well attended meeting of the executive of the Dominion Alliance for the Total Suppression of the Liquor Traffic was held yesterday afternoon at the Alliance offices, in the Confederation Life Building. In view of the fact that the constitutionalality of the Prince Edward Island prohibitory enactment is likely to be speedily tested by prosecutions in the case of its violation and the uncertainty regarding the Manitoba law, it was deemed advisable to defer action for provincial prohibition until after the prohibitionists at the province meets in convention. A similar attitude was taken in regard to the Dominion aspect of the situation. After considering the date and place of meeting of the convention the secretary, Mr. F. S. Spence was authorized to prepare a call for an Ontario Provincial Convention to be held in Toronto on Tuesday, July 9, and a meeting of the Dominion Council of the Alliance on the following day.

THE DANISH WEST INDIES.

COPENHAGEN, April 17.—The government is earnestly considering the recent somewhat modified proposal with regard to the sale of the United States of the Danish West Indies, which is considered likely to lead to a satisfactory termination of the negotiations. Official circles are of the opinion that the two governments are now nearer an agreement than at a previous time.
