WHEN THE SENATE ADJOURNS.

The Senate of Canada adjourned on the 10th of April to the 6th day of May. The country will be glad to hear of it. It brings the venerable House into notice. Had it not ceased from its labors the country would probably not have heard of the Senate during the month to come any more than it has heard during the months that are past.

There are other aspects of the adjournment fitting to be considered by an obliging and amiable country. A man may work too hard, and have only himself to blame. A man who would force his aged father to work beyond his strength would be no better than a brute.

And their pay will go on during the twenty-six days of their rest. That is doubtless a comfort to the wise old men, as they sit in the warm shelter of their homes and firesides. It spoils a holiday when the pay stops during the period of rest and recuperation.

It is true that the Senatorial adjournment causes some inconvenience. The Parliament which consists of three branches, the Governor General, the Senate and the House of Commons, can only work in a lop-sided way during an adjournment. It requires all three branches in working to make laws, levy taxes and vote moneys. So for twenty-six days to come no bill can be enacted into law, or receive His Excellency's sanction.

POSTMASTER GENERAL LEMIEUX.

Hitherto, we have noted with pleasure not a few good measures and administrative acts to the credit of Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux, who for the past two years has been Postmaster General of Canada. Sir William Mulock had distinguished himself above all his predecessors in that important office. When he resigned in 1905 to accept a position on the bench his fame was as wide as the British Empire.

Six months later, after the temporary occupancy of Mr. Aylesworth, the Postmaster Generalship fell to Mr. Lemieux. It was a hard task to follow to energetic and remarkably capable an administrator as Sir William Mulock, but Mr. Lemieux appears to have risen to the occasion and quite surpassed the expectations of his friends as Postmaster General. Both parties and the country at large recognise his fitness for the position he holds.

Sir William Mulock, greatly extended the postal service of Canada, increased its utility, lowered the rates of postage and turned the large annual deficits into still larger surpluses. Mr. Lemieux has increased the large surpluses of his distinguished predecessor to a point well beyond the million mark, has extended the carrier system to many of the smaller cities, including Charlottetown, extended the mail routes, added hundreds of new post-offices, increased the frequency of service and improved the postal system in many ways.

And now, further to his credit, Mr. Lemieux has quite unexpectedly added the new departure that in all future mail contracts the mail

carriers will be precluded from conveying intoxicating liquors. Most heartily do we commend this action which will meet with the approval of the best citizenship from one end of Canada to the other and in no part of the Dominion will it be more warmly approved than in Prince Edward Island.

THE LEGISLATIVE SECRET.

The Patriot, as in duty bound, defends the acceptance of \$200 each by members of the Legislature at the close of last session on the ground that a minute of the Governor in Council had been passed recommending such payment, and that "this sensible proposal was agreed to by both sides of the House."

The fact remains that the Governor in Council had no power or authority to make this appropriation. Only the House itself had that power and the matter was never before the House at all. If the money had been voted by the House the record would show it. There is no such record on the journals of the House. Private talk or agreement among members to divide certain public moneys between themselves was not a legal or proper thing to do. If the money had been voted by the House the people would have known what was done. As it was, the people did not know, although they had a right to know.

The Patriot rarely quotes this journal correctly. For instance it speaks of "The Guardian's painful secret." The Guardian had not spoken at all of a painful secret, but of a "painful rumor that the Legislature cherished a secret," which is another and a different matter altogether. Our view was that the Legislature should have no secrets and should not conceal any of its doings from the people.
