THE CASE AGAINST A CANADIAN NAVY.

"Two naval and military experts are utterly opposed to war and lent by the British Government are to increased war expenditure. It is now in Ottawa and, unless some only the naval and military experts...

Mr Marshall professes to find that only in the east and west of the Dominion is there any strong support for the movement to create a Canadian navy. He affirms that in the central provinces there is respect for Sir Wilfred Laurier's good judgement and a belief that he will find some way of shelving both the Dreadnought and the local navy scheme. As for the prairie provinces with their mixed population of Americans and Europeans, he finds them opposed either to building ships for Britain or setting up a navy of our own.

There seems no doubt that the Government of the day is committed to that policy and, as in the case of the saary grab, the astute Liberal leader has secured the concurrence of the Conservative leader in advance. Mr Borden has tied his own hands. He might have made a fight on the navy question and gathered much support in Quebec and the west. He could have made it clear to the country that navy building will be enormously expensive when once begun. He has chosen rather to share the responsibility for the outlay, and has sacrificed his party weapons that Canada may have a navy.

So we are in for it. Those opposed to navy building have no leader, be they few or many. The militia expenditure has jumped up fivefold in ten years. Soon we shall be spending ten millions a year on our militia and our cruisers, whether or not there shall be a foe in sight and whether or not our own fleet of cruisers shall be found of any practical value if war should come. We are rapidly drifting into militarism, with perhaps the greatest half of the country opposed to it, but mainly silent.

REPORT OF THE POSTMASTER GENERAL.

The annual report of the Postmaster General for 1908-9 shows a remarkable expansion of the postal service during the year. Post offices were increased in number by 556, postal note offices by 680 and money order offices by 196. The railway mail routes have been extended by 2,034 miles, while the mails have been carried during the year over railway and water routes and ordinary land routes a total of 1,312,073 miles greater than the preceding year.

During the year the free letter carrier service was extended to eight additional towns and cities and the rate on drop letters in places thus served was reduced from two cents to one cent, a change that has been much appreciated. So great an extension of the postal service, including the beginning of rural free delivery of necessity enlarged the expenditure, but still left a handsome surplus of \$809,237 on the year's transactions. This is the eighth surplus in as many years.

The report shows that Prince Edward Island, with 465 post offices, transmitted 3,052,000 letters, 202,000
