# POLICE KEEP WATCH ON MISS KINRADE

HAMILTON, Ont., March 27—The police surveillance of Miss Florence Kinrade has not yet been removed, two local officers, Constables Tuck and McLean, are boarding at Coldberg's Hotel and are constantly watching the residence of Miss Walker, the nurse, where Miss Kinrade is staying. Should the Kinrade family leave the city one of these officers likely would be detailed to keep the young woman in view. T. L. Kinrade, father of the murdered girl, made the following statement this morning:

"I do not blame the detectives or Mr. Blackstock for holding their theories. Some person wrote a letter to the Attorney-General, telling him there was no tramp in the case and the Attorney-General issued stringent instructions to Mr. Blackstock to prove the case to the bitter end. He has done so to the detriment of my family."

Mr. Kinrade further says: "Miss Marion Elliot is an elderly woman, and a good Christian. She is a daughter of a Dr. Elliot, who lived in England. Miss Elliott married Col. Warburton, of the British army, who had known her from infancy. They are now in California. We had known Miss Elliott well and would not have allowed Florence to go away with her if we had not."

Mr. Kinrade volunteered the information that it was Florence's intention to become a grand opera singer. TEN-SHOT REVOLVER. That the person who murdered Ethel had but one revolver, which was not reloaded in the house, despite the fact that nine shots were fired, is the latest theory in the case.

The discovery by Geo. Lynch-Staunton, K. C., of the manufacture of a ten-chambered revolver has put a new complexion on the case. It was thought at first that an automatic pistol was used. These weapons fire eight shots at one loading, but it was established that the revolver with which the deed was done was of low pressure, and an automatic pistol will kill at 1,000 yards that theory was abandoned. The other theories advanced in this connection were that the murderer either had two revolvers or that he reloaded the weapon in the house to be able to fire nine shots, for there is no nine-chambered weapon made.

Mr. Staunton came into possession of an advertisement which may throw some light on this future of the case. It was an advertisement of a ten-chambered revolver made in an American city. Mr. Staunton showed this advertisement to Crown-Attorney Washington, and discussing the matter Mr. Washington stated that the weapon appeared to be a heavy caliber.

**SIGNIFICANT FIND.** The fact that one of the family solicitors thought the matter of sufficient importance to notify the crown attorney is considered significant, if the murderer used this style of revolver, it should be easy to trace. The theory is strengthening that the strange man seen by Mrs. Ogg on Charlottetown street on the afternoon of the murder was the same one who created some excitement at the residence of Mrs. Arthur Taylor, 164 Markland street, the same afternoon. The stranger in each case wore a peak cap and short overcoat.

There is a persistent rumor that the members of the Kinrade family intended to leave the city. Earl Kinrade stated that he heard his father say nothing of the matter. He stated that the father might go to Toronto or elsewhere until the night the inquiry is to be resumed, and might even remove from the city for all time, but he had heard nothing about the intentions of his parents.

## PRINCE'S ACTIVITY SURPRISES FRIENDS

LONDON, March 28—Many people have been noticing lately how very active the Prince of Wales has been. Hardly a day has passed since his return to London, five or six weeks ago, without his visiting some hospital or public institution.

He has been to about a score of hospitals by now. He has attended certain scientific lectures and made a speech to cadets on patriotism, which has fairly stormed the hearts of the people. Besides all this he has his routine duties and his work in relation to the Duchy of Cornwall, to which he always attends personally. He has dined with the Savage Club and the Automobile Club, and I suppose that these two occasions may be taken as rather less matters of duty than the others.

The only question is whether he does not take his life too seriously. Some of his friends seem to think that the capacity for sheer enjoyment which has been not only a relief but even a valuable asset to King Edward for fifty years has found no place among the Prince's qualities, at least if his place is not in the public eye. His circle of friends is very small, and his house is really the centre of his happiness and England his chief interest, even to a point which almost reaches insularity.

The contrast between the King and the Prince works in their personal relations—as contrasts so often do—extremely well, and it is to be remembered that circumstances have made it more difficult for the Prince than it was for the King to find his public work.
