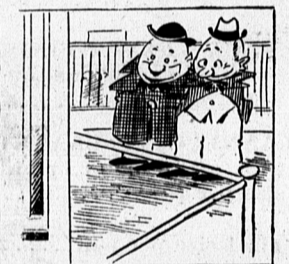

MR. HERBERT CHAMPION

The death occurred at his home in Alberton yesterday morning of Mr. Herbert Champion, aged 49 years. He underwent an operation in Montreal a year ago, but although he seemed to be regaining his health, six months ago his condition again became serious and since then he gradually sank until the end came. He was the son of the late Captain John Champion, one of the pioneers of the fox industry in this Province.

The late Mr. Champion was also extensively engaged in fox ranching, and also conducted a large lobster packing business. He was one of the most prominent and highly respected residents of Alberton, and was Church Warden in the Anglican Church for many years.

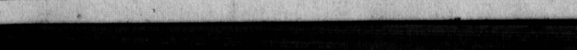
