So when Friend Wife meets him at the door with a fresh hair-do and her complexion on, and brightly suggests that they go out somewhere to dine and dance, or announces that the Borems are coming over to spend the evening and play bridge, he groans in misery and wants to know why, in Heaven's name, they have a home if they never stay in it. Or he curses the man who first thought up a foursome. And the wife doesn't want to spend a quiet evening by herself. ## THE COOK'S CORNER

### CRISP GINGER COOKIES

2-3 cup sugar  
1 cup molasses  
1 cup shortening  
1 teaspoon baking soda  
2 teaspoons ginger  
1-4 cup vinegar

Four c. milk  
Mix sugar, molasses and vinegar. Add melted shortening. Sift soda and ginger with one cup of flour and add mixture. Add enough flour to roll very thin. Bake in a moderate oven 375°F. for 10 to 12 minutes, watching carefully, as ginger cookies burn rather easily.

### PIMENTO RELISH

12 medium-sized green tomatoes  
2 medium onions  
4 sweet red peppers  
1 small can pimentos  
2-2 cups brown sugar  
1 teaspoon curry powder  
1 teaspoon mustard seed  
1 1/2 teaspoons salt

Vinegar, malt or cider  
Method: Wash and core the green tomatoes, and skin them or not, as desired. Peel the onions. Remove the seeds from the sweet red peppers. Put the prepared green tomatoes, onions, and peppers, and the drained pimentos through the food chopper, using a fine blade. Place the chopped vegetables in a preserving kettle and add the brown sugar, curry powder, mustard seed, and salt. Mix thoroughly, then add enough vinegar to cover the mixture. Heat slowly to the boiling point, then place over low heat and continue cooking at a simmering temperature until the mixture is somewhat thickened and the vegetables are soft. Pour into hot, sterilized jars and seal with melted paraffin. Store in a cool, dry place.

**DEAD CAT IN CHANCERY**

The subject of cat legacies recently mentioned in "Miscellany" went into Chancery in 1838 says Lucio in the Manchester Guardian. The Vice-Chancellor asked for evidence of the death. The Registrar pursued the hare (or rather the cat) farther, it was all very well to produce an affidavit, but that would not justify the court in making an order, since it would establish no more than the fact of one death whereas a cat had proverbially nine lives.
