**MR. THOMAS TAYLOR.**—The attention of the electors of Ward Five is directed to the card of Thomas Taylor which appears elsewhere in this paper. Mr. Taylor was induced almost at the last moment to accept nomination. **THE MORWENNA.**—The steamer Morwenna, which has until this port was closed to navigation been running here from Montreal, on the Black Diamond Line, has been chartered for the Red Cross Line service between Halifax and St. John and New York. The steamer is at present returning to St. John's from a trip she made to Brazil, and she then goes to New York to take up the Red Cross service. The Morwenna has been engaged to fill the vacancy caused in the service by the removal of the Stephano for a sealing voyage for which she is now being fitted.

**MARITIME MEN IN DEMAND.**—It was pointed out in the St. John Globe the other day that the lately deceased Chief of Police in Vancouver B. C., was a former resident of Woodstock, N. B., and that the present head of the Vancouver fire department hailed from Hillsboro, N. B. Vancouver papers now relate that the new Chief of Police is Mr. B. McLellan, who was born in Montague P. E. I., 29 years ago, and has been twelve years on the force, and that the deputy chief is Wm. McPae, a native of Flat River, F. K. I., who has been eleven years on the force.

**DR. MANDERSON.**—Dr. M. Mable Manderon, who has been engaged in medical missionary work in Peking, China, for nearly six years, is spending the winter in Chicago and further pursuing her medical studies. It will be remembered that Dr. Manderon was a visitor to the Island in the early fall when she was the guest of her mother, Mrs. C. P. Manderon of Hamilton, and on her way to Chicago she visited her sister, Mrs. Gordon of South Beach, Ind., where she spent Xmas, and at Kansas City, where she attended the Student Volunteer Convention. Dr. Manderon proposes a protracted visit to the Island next summer, previous to her return to China in the autumn.

**COURT OF CHANCERY.**—Before the Honourable R. Fitzgerald, Vice-Chancellor of the Court of Chancery yesterday heard the case of George Burge vs. James J. Burge. The suit was brought to get aside two deeds of twenty-five and fifty acres, respectively, on Lot 22, and also an agreement made between complainant and defendant respecting another fifty acres of land known as the Homestead. After the evidence for the plaintiff had been given, Mr. J. J. Johnston, on behalf of the defendant, urged that the case be dismissed on the ground that the plaintiff had not made out sufficient equity to entitle him to relief. The case will be resumed today. Messrs. W. S. Stewart, K. C., and A. MacDonald, K. C., appeared for the plaintiff, while Mr. Johnston represented the defendant.
